FRIDAY, April 20, 1866.

HIS Excellency the Lieut. Governor having come down to the Council Chamber, this night, at ten o'clock, was pleased to give his assent to the Bill intituled as follows, viz:

1. An Act for Raising a Revenue.

FRIDAY, May 11, 1866.

This day, at 4 o'clock, p. m., His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor again came down to the Council Chamber, and assented to the Bills intituled as follow, viz:

2. An Act for the purpose of transferring the Funds raised by the Sale of the Military Barracks in Charlottetown, to the purposes therein mentioned.

3. An Act to incorporate the Western Bank.

4. An Act to incorporate the Charlottetown Woolen Factory Company.

5. An Act to compel Masters of Vessels to exhibit a Light while in harbor in the night time.

6. An Act to incorporate the Minister and Trustees of the Presbyterian Church of Cascumpec.

7. An Act to amend the Act incorporating of the Minister and Elders of St. John's Church in the District, of Belfast.

7. An Act to incorporate Mechanics' Fishing Company, Charlottetown.

9. An Act to amend the Act intituled "An Act for establishing a Court of Divorce in this Island and for repealing a certain Act therein mentioned."

10. An Act to incorporate the Minister and Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Brackley Point Road, Township 33.

11. An Act to incorporate the Minister and Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Cardigan, Township No. 53.

12. An Act to continue certain Acts therein mentioned.

13. An Act to incorporate the Grand Lodge of the British Order of Good Templars of P. E. Island, and to provide for the incorporation of the County and Primary Lodges in connection therewith.

38. An Act to alter the Act constituting the Legislative Council elective.

39. An Act to prevent the concealment of Arms or Munitions of War, intended for unlawful purposes.
