### Turns Jail Into Love Nest, Has Term Extended

KREMS, Austria (AP)—A pretty housemaid, jailed for stealing jewels from an English lord, has found her sentence increased by a prison guard. The second authorities charged, convicted and turning the local prison into a love nest.

They gave this account:  
The former maid, Leopoldine Schoeb, 24, was sentenced to 2½ years in jail here for stealing some \$1,000 worth of gems while in the employment of Lord Rendlesham. Behind bars she turned her attentions on a 30-year-old guard. The guard succumbed to her charms.

When the other prisoners found out what was going on they began to blackmail the guard into arranging meetings between male and female prisoners. They also made him serve as a cell-to-cell bearer of love letters.

A court sentenced the guard to eight months at hard labor. The maid got another four months tacked on her sentence. Although the jewel theft occurred in London, the maid was sentenced here under provision of Austrian law dealing with persons arrested for crimes in foreign countries.

### British Fashion Houses Plan Russian Show

LONDON (CP)—Eleven leading British fashion houses held a preview Wednesday of the women's outfits they will show to Russian housewives next month.

The preview was in the form of a send-off party for the six models who will fly to Moscow June 7 to parade British fashions twice daily before Russian women at the Gorki hall. Guests at the party included representatives from the Russian Embassy.

The models will display 60 outfits ranging from beautiful evening wraps and fur coats to lingerie and heavy walking shoes. Night attire includes filmy nylon negligees and—apparently mindful of cold Russian winters—heavy flannel pyjamas appropriately embroidered with red stars.

Mrs. Betty Miller, dark-haired London journalist who has been in Moscow making preliminary arrangements for the show, said Russian women are looking forward to seeing British fashions.

"Posters are up all over Moscow and nearly all the seats have been sold." She estimated more than 50,000 Russians would visit the show.

### Report B.C. Leads In Alcoholics

SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP)—British Columbia leads the provinces in estimated numbers of alcoholics based on population, Dr. J. K. W. Ferguson of Toronto told the Canadian Public Health Association Wednesday.

The director of the Connaught medical research laboratories placed New Brunswick half way down the list, with British Columbia having about double the N.B. figure.

Dr. Ferguson said no specific figures were available, as Alcoholics Anonymous—now providing the most successful treatment—is not a statistical organization.

"The problem is very serious in some parts of the United States, California has a special situation, and estimates there are double those of British Columbia."

Dr. Ira Hiscock, New Haven, Conn., president of the American Public Health Association, described relief measures in disaster areas. The most important need was experienced supply personnel to balance actual requirements and eager, well-meaning volunteers.
