**THE FIGURES REVERSED.**—The marriage is reported at Westbrook, Cumberland Co., N. S., of a widower aged 41 and a girl of 14.

**COUNTERFEIT MONEY.**—A great quantity of counterfeit coin is now in circulation in Hamilton, Ont. The police have a clue on which they are working in an endeavor to run down the counterfeiters.

**INSURANCE AGENTS TAXED.**—The city council of Calgary have passed a by-law imposing a tax on \$25 per year on all insurance agents doing business in Calgary. The penalty for not taking out a license is \$100.

**STRUCK IT RICH.**—Dr. Philippe LeBlanc writing from Dawson to his brother Evariste at Moncton, says he is coming out in August. He went in early and has made money in his profession. He secured four claims, and has refused \$50,000 for each. He refused \$8,000 for a cottage he built last fall.

**AN OLD STORY.**—An interesting legal action has been instituted at Ottawa. Philip Ross, of Mulgrave, is suing John Middlestead, township of Derry, for \$900, on a revocation of a deed of donation. Peter Ross, the plaintiff's brother, in a moment of insanity, as alleged, gave his farm to the defendant, on the latter undertaking to keep him all his life. This promise Middlestead failed to fulfil, hence the action.

**A BOY ATTACKED.**—Willie McGregor, of Ridgeway, Ont., was attacked by a ferocious brood sow, which had broken in upon the premises. The animal had bitten his arm and wrist in a terrible manner, when its attention was diverted by his dog going in the direction of her brood, a few feet away. By the time she returned after guarding her young, the boy had managed to get on top of the fence out of her reach. The lad was brought to town where his injuries were attended to by a doctor.

**THREE SUDDEN DEATHS.**—On Sunday morning Mr John Keith, a respected resident of Kennebecasis Island, started with his son to row to Bayswater church. When only a short distance from the shore he fell over in the boat dead. Deceased was eighty-four years of age.

Mr Edward Moriarity, of Douglas avenue, attended church on Sunday and was apparently well. While at dinner he was taken suddenly ill and passed away in about fifteen minutes after the arrival of the doctor and priest. Deceased was a well known citizen and for many years carried on the tailoring business on Main street. He leaves two daughters.

Mr Wm Purvis, Metcalf street, was found dead in bed Saturday morning. He had been a sufferer from asthma.—St John Globe.

**BERLIN, Aug 1.**—A morning paper reports that the Chinese warship Jutschi has been sunk at Port Arthur during a storm, and 146 persons drowned. No such Chinese warship is listed, and it is possible an error has been made in the transmission of the name by cable.
