TABLE OF THE RATES OF POSTAGE as established by Act of Parliament.

Single Letters in England.—British Pence.
FROM any Post Office in England, to
 any Place not exceeding one Stage from
 such Office, *Two Pence.*
 To any Place above one, and not exceed-
 ing two Stages from such Office, and not
 passing through London, *Three Pence.*
 To any Place above two Stages, not ex-
 ceeding 80 Miles, and not passing through
 London, *Four Pence.*
 To any Place above 80, and not exceeding
 150 Miles, and not passing through London,
Five Pence.
 To any Place above 150 Miles, and not
 passing through London, *Six Pence.*

A Proclamation.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament,
 made and passed in the twenty eighth
 Year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled "An
 Act for regulating the Trade between his
 Majesty's Colonies and the Plantations in
 North America, and in the West India Isl-
 ands, and the Countries belonging to the
 United States of America, and between his
 Majesty's said Subjects, and the foreign
 Islands in the West Indies,"

Given under my Hand and Seal at Arms,
 at Charlotte Town, Island Saint John,
 this sixteenth Day of July, in the Year
 of our Lord, one Thousand seven Hun-
 dred and Ninety-two, and in the thirty
 second Year of his Majesty's Reign.

COD SAVE THE KING.

No Goods or Commodities whatever can
 be imported into the Island of Saint John,
 except certain Articles therein mentioned,
 the Importation of which Goods and Com-
 modities, or any of them, may be authorised
 by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or
 Commander in Chief, with the Advice of
 his Majesty's Council:

AND WHEREAS it is necessary from pub-
 lic Emergency and to prevent Distress to
 the Settlers of this Island, that the Importa-
 tion of the Goods and Commodities as per-
 mitted by the aforesaid Act, and herein af-
 ter mentioned, should be authorised and
 permitted for a longer Time, for the Supply
 of the Inhabitants of the Island:

I HAVE THEREFORE THOUGHT FIT, with
 the Advice and Consent of his Majesty's
 Council, to publish this Proclamation, au-
 thorising and permitting, and I do hereby
 authorise and permit, the Importation of the
 following Goods or Commodities into this
 Island, that is to say, Scantling, Planks,
 Staves, Heading-Boards, Shingles, Hoops,
 or squared Timber of any Sort, Horses,
 Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or live

SCOTLAND.
 Between London and Edinburgh, Dum-
 fries, or Cockburnspeth, *Seven Pence.*
 From any Post Office in Scotland to any
 Place not exceeding one Stage from such
 Office, *Two Pence.*
 To any Place in the same Kingdom above
 one Stage, and not exceeding 50 Miles, and
 not passing thro' Edinburgh, *Three Pence.*
 To any Place in the same Kingdom above
 50 and not exceeding 80 Miles, and not pass-
 ing through Edinburgh, *Four Pence.*
 To any Place in the same Kingdom above
 80, and not exceeding 150, and not passing
 through Edinburgh, *Five Pence.*
 To any Place above 150 miles, and not
 passing through Edinburgh, *Six Pence.*
 Between Port Patrick, in Scotland, and
 Donaghadee, in Ireland, by Packet Boats,
 over and above all other Rates, *Two Pence.*
 Letters to and from any Part of England
 and any Part of Scotland, not passing thro'
 London, Edinburgh, Dumfries, or Cock-
 burnspeth, are not chargeable, if single,
 higher than *Seven Pence.*

Letters to and from Glasgow, or the inter-
 mediate Places, by Carlisle, are not to pay
 any higher Rate of Postage than if sent
 through Edinburgh.

IRELAND.

Between London and Dublin, by Way
 of Holy Head, *Six Pence.*
 Between London and Dublin, by Way
 of Carlisle and Port Patrick, *Twelve Pence.*
