## The Transvaal War

Catholics in the Transvaal.

(New Era, London, Catholic paper.)

We referred in a note last week to some statements made in the Irish News as to the number of Catholics employed in the government service in the Transvaal. Our contemporary described the charge of intolerance brought against the Boers as hypocritical, and declared that Dr. Leyds, among other Transvaal officials, is a Catholic. We pointed out that there is a stringent Test Act in the Transvaal which prevents any Catholic from holding an office unless he was false to his religion. Our statement is more than confirmed by a letter from an Irish Priest—Father J. J. O'Reilly, of Wynberg, South Africa, which was published on Tuesday in the Daily Nation, which had, it appears, repeated the statements of the Irish News. Father O'Reilly, speaking from personal experience, says:

1. It is against the laws of the S. A. Republic for any Catholic to hold office of any kind in the State, or to vote for the Raads, or the President, no matter how long he may have been in the country. Catholic and Jews are ranked with colored people and "illegitimates" in these disabilities.

2. President Kruger, to gain their favor, quite recently proposed to remove Catholics and Jews from such a degrading category, but whether he was sincere or not, the Raad rejected his proposition. Consequently, if the rather wild assertions of your correspondent were true, this would simply mean defiance of the law, and an enemy would merely have to draw the attention of the government to the fact in order to oust such Catholics out of their positions.

3. The only people who employ Catholics in the Transvaal, aye and liberally support Catholic institutions, too, are the much decried capitalists, who employ one hundred thousand people, irrespective of creed or nationality, and pay four millions annually in taxes to the government.

4. As to Leyds, he must have concealed his Catholicity very successfully. I for one should not be more astonished if I heard that Satan himself were a loyal son of the Church!

With regard to a statement also made in some of Irish contemporaries as to an alleged gift by the Transvaal government to Catholic nuns in Pretoria, Father O'Reilly says:

"As to the Pretoria nuns, the gift, if any, was from the British government which, in 1881, stipulated for the non-disturbance of existing institutions, when handing over to the Transvaal executive. My own conviction is, however, that there was no gift whatever, but simply compensation for destruction of property during the siege—the British garrison having occupied the convent as the best strategic position for the defence of the town."

Father O'Reilly's letter should hardly have been necessary, since the facts which he states as to the intolerance of the Transvaal government were well known long ago, and the contrary statements which have appeared in several papers must be attributed to a too lively imagination. We trust we shall hear no more of such nonsense after Father O'Reilly's exposure. Catholics in Italy—and elsewhere—who congratulate the mules that stamped at Nicholson's Nek and wax jubilant over the approaching downfall of Great Britain which their imagination conceives will no longer have the excuse of ignorance of the facts. 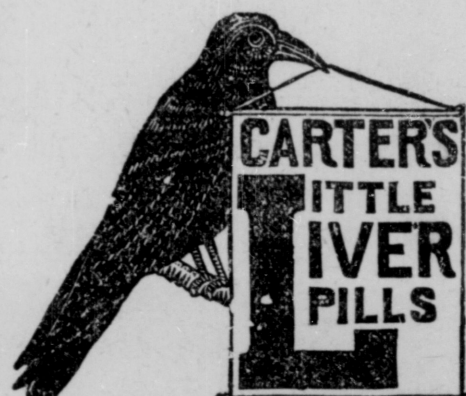

### Interesting Fact.

The Canadian Gazette, of London, Eng., recalls the interesting fact the Gloucestershire Regiment, which has lately been so conspicuous in South Africa, figures prominently in Canadian history. It was in 1694 that Sir John Gibson, for many years Governor of Portsmouth, was appointed colonel of the regiment, then recently raised, but little is known of its history at this period. It is certain, however, that four years later, after service in the West Indies and Newfoundland, it was disbanded, and that one detachment remained, forgotten or otherwise, at Newfoundland. Thus the regiment claims to date from 1694. After serving in the Low Countries under Marlborough, the regiment, in 1757, embarked for America, and served under Wolfe at the capture of Louisbourg, at Cape Breton, and at the great victory before Quebec. Its members have always taken a melancholy pride in the fact that Wolfe was at its head, leading the assault, when he fell wounded. He was supported in his dying moments, and carried back to the rear by Lieut. Brown, an officer of the regiment, and a volunteer named Hudson. Though it fought so gallantly on this occasion, it was not until 1882 that the regiment was permitted to have "Quebec" emblazoned on its colours.

Ladysmith is called after the wife of Sir Harry Smith, formerly Commanding General in South Africa. She was a Spanish girl, to whom the General gave protection, when he was a subaltern in the Peninsular War, and who subsequently married him. Harris-smith is named after her husband.
