The author of Psalm 105 reminds his listeners that God has always taken marvelous care of His chosen people.

The author recalls how Joseph was sold into slavery in Egypt so that when a great famine came to Israel, Joseph's brothers could come to him and beg the Israelites to leave Mesopotamia for the land of Canaan to Abraham's descendants.

God later sent His servant Moses to deliver His people from their bondage in Egypt. Through Moses, plagues descended on the Egyptians until they begged the Israelites to leave Mesopotamia for the land of Canaan to Abraham's descendants.

God took care of His people on their 40-year journey through the wilderness to their promised land. He provided them with water. He once opened a rock and made water gush forth.

Israelites Leave Egypt

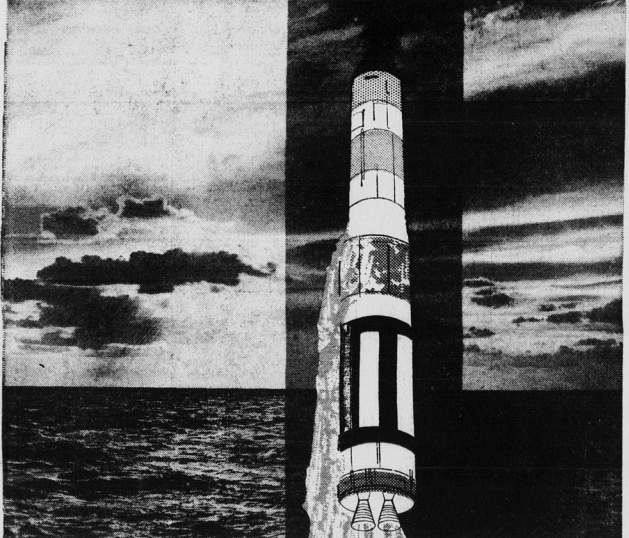

What other country has done more to give thanks to God? Three of the psalms bear especially on the early history of Israel, the 78th, the 105th and the 106th. Each of these three, however, emphasizes a different aspect of the meaning of this history. The 78th aims at teaching a lesson, recalling the past as a warning about present and future actions. The 105th stresses, there is no nation on earth today to whom it applies more generally than our own. What other country enjoys

as many blessings as do we? What other country has more cause to give thanks to God? Three of the psalms bear especially on the early history of Israel, the 78th, the 105th and the 106th. Each of these three, however, emphasizes a different aspect of the meaning of this history. The 78th aims at teaching a lesson, recalling the past as a warning about present and future actions. The 105th stresses, there is no nation on earth today to whom it applies more generally than our own. What other country enjoys

leaves not all mention of Israel's shortcomings, and issues no warning for the future, but instead concentrates on the aspect of God's great goodness to His chosen people, and his wonderful deeds on their behalf. It is a hymn of thanksgiving. In fact, the first 15 verses are found with only slight variation, as the first part of the celebration song sung when the Ark was brought to Zion by David (I Chronicles 16:8-22).

In the first verse of this psalm, the instruction to "call upon His name" means, of course, to call upon God Himself. The "judgments of His mouth" (verse 5) probably refers to God's pronouncements against the Egyptian rulers. The Pharaoh's resistance challenged God to challenge the Egyptian gods, each plague being an attack on one of them (verses 21-36).
