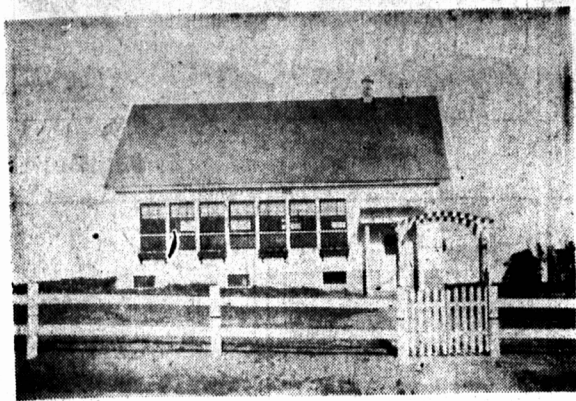
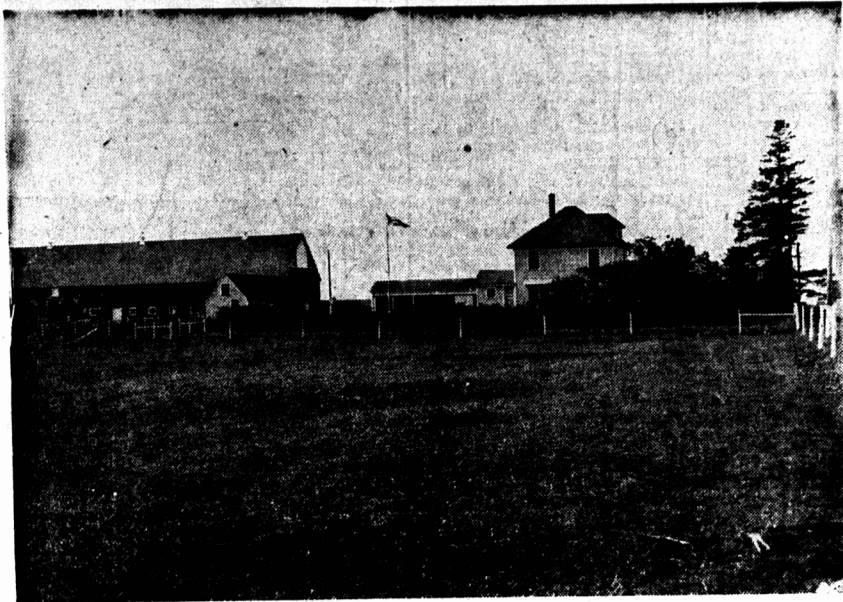

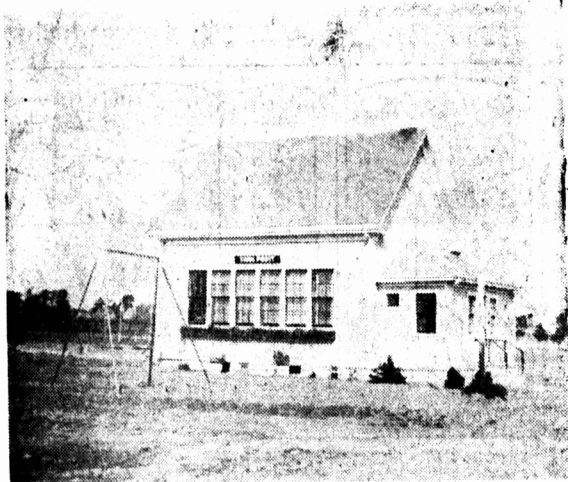
Spring Valley School, winner of the School Improvement Competition in Prince County.



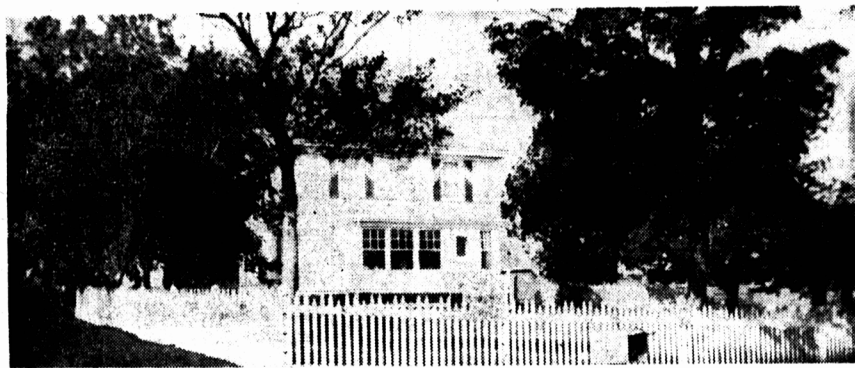

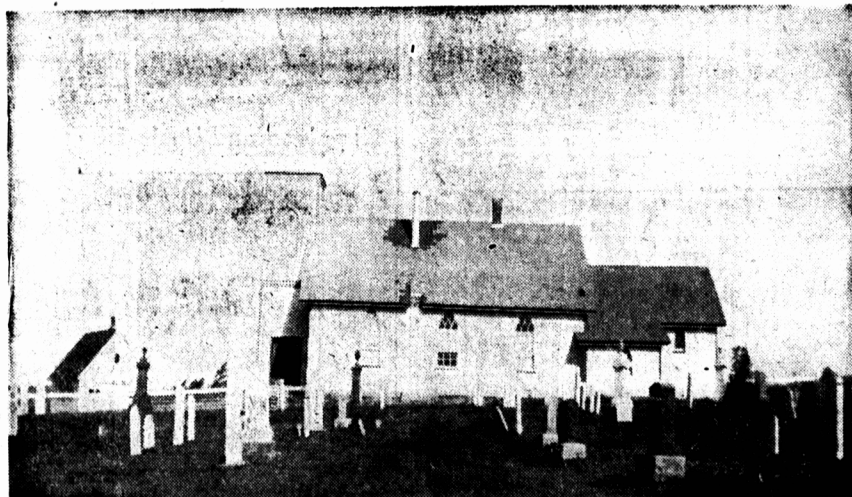

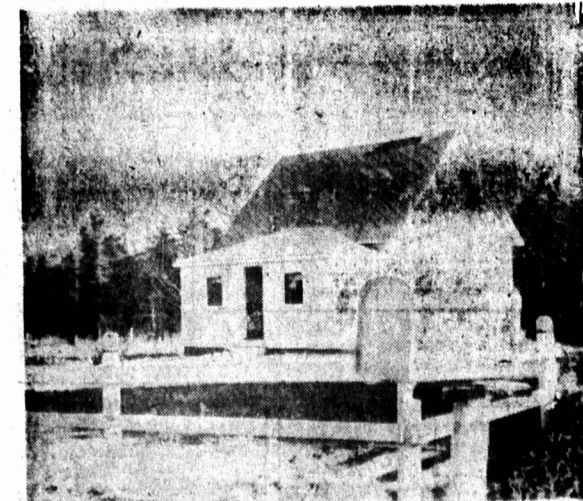
