N. Y. Mart Has War-boom

NEW YORK, Sept. 10 (CP)—Financial Markets Saturday concluded the fastest war-boom week in their history with stock prices still pointing upward but with profit sellings inclinations tending to stem the forward push.

The stock market got off to a flying start in the brief session, with blocks of as much as 5,000 shares changing hands at gains running to more than 2 points. Final prices were below the best in many cases. Late favorites, however, ended around top levels. There also was an assortment of losers.

The associated press average of 60 stocks retained a net advance of .2 of a point at \$1.1. On the week the composite was up 4.4 points, largest gain for this period since June, 1938. The day's turnover of 1,556,900 shares compared with 1,791,250 last Saturday.

Marine Construction Company and Warehousing issues put on a fast sprint as indications of heavy shipbuilding demand were seen in the announcement Bethlehem Steel had been awarded a contract by the Maritime Commission for 10 cargo vessels costing \$19,400,000. Among the liveliest stocks of the day were Bethlehem Common at 88 3/4, up 3 1/4; International Mercantile Marine 14 3/4; up 3 1/4; N. Y. Dock, 8 1/4, up 3 3/8; Electric Boat, 15 3/8; up 2 1/4; N. Y. Shipbuilding, 15 3/8, up 1 1/4; and Bush Terminal, 5 3/8, up 2 1/2.

Holding part of early improvement were U. S. Steel, General Motors, United Aircraft, American Smelting, Texas Corp., Western Union, Sears Roebuck, N. Y. Central and U. S. Rubber.

Typing moderately were Chrysler, Woolworth, Douglas Aircraft, U. S. Gypsum, Westinghouse, Anaconda and Faard Sugar.

GRAIN

CHICAGO, Sept. 10 (CP)—A heavy wave of profit taking caused grain prices to slump markedly yesterday, wiping out a portion of the past week's upturn that followed the start of Europe's war.

A decline of more than 3 cents in wheat put values 7 to 8 cents a bushel under highs recorded on Thursday but left the market about 14 cents above the lows prior to the outbreak of hostilities and 19 cents above prices a year ago. Corn lost 2 1/2 cents to more than 3 cents.

Although rallying slightly just before the end, wheat closed 2 1/4-3 3/4 cents lower than Friday.

Sept. 8-8, Dec. 8-2-3-4; Corn 1 5/8-3 1/2 lower, Sept. 5-56 3/8, Dec. 56 1 1/4-56; Oats 3-4 1/8-8 down.

Nos. 2, 3 and 4 Northern attracted a little mill interest in an otherwise quiet cash wheat market. Hedging and commission house selling set coarse grain prices to lower levels.
