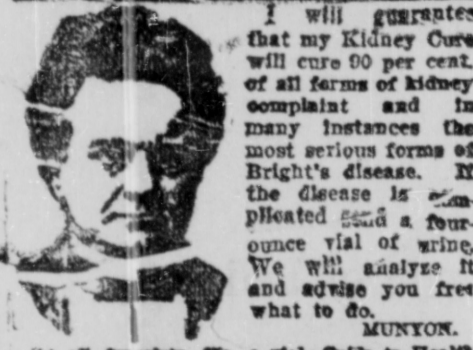

Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.

WOUNDED THAT WON WIVES.
Part That the Bullet has Played in Love Affairs.

Not long ago a young fellow of good family thought to assuage the pangs of disappointed love by the active duties of a soldier's life. He enlisted: his regiment was ordered to South Africa and was among those that opposed the Boers at Glencoe. Not many hours later the young lady who had been the cause of his leaving home read his name among the list of wounded, and was so horrified at the result of her rejection of her lover that, smitten with remorse, she at once telegraphed her regret and accepted him for her husband. Let us hope that such pretty romance will reach a happy consummation.

A young artisan proposed to the daughter of a well-to-do Birmingham tradesman, and was contumeliously shown the door by her parents. In a fit of despair he joined the army, served through the Afghan campaign, where he was so badly wounded as to necessitate a re-entry into civil life. Unable on account of his injury, to follow his old occupation, he obtained the post of attendant on an invalid gentleman, who, on his decease, left him sufficient money to buy a share in the business of the very man who sometimes before had refused him the hand of his daughter, but who now was only too glad to reconsider his determination.

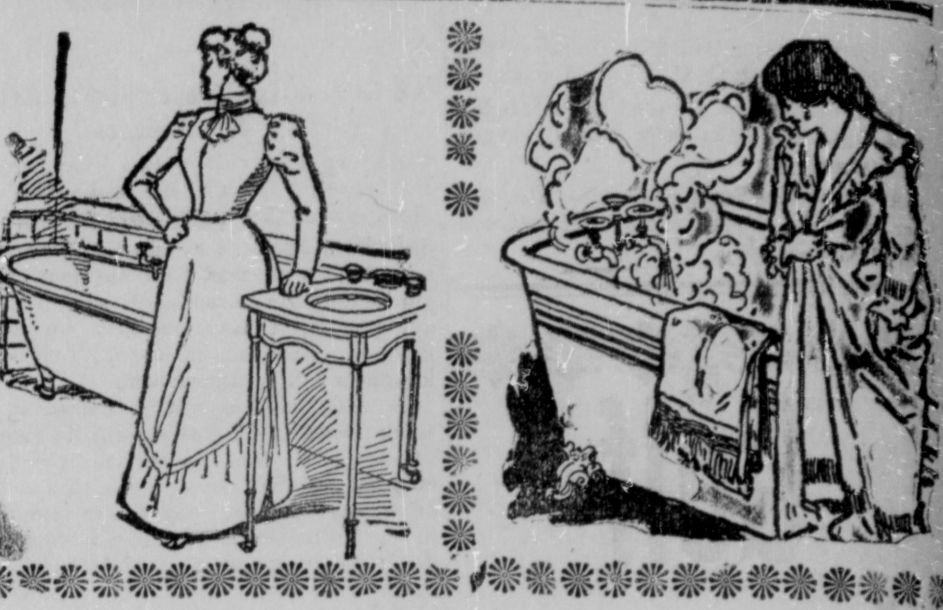
