Bank Of Montreal Predicts Economy Strong For Years

By KEN SMITH Canadian Press Business Editor The Canadian economy should be perfectly capable of maintaining its post-war average growth rate at least up to 1970, the Bank of Montreal predicts. If that average is maintained—and the bank says in its monthly business review it may well be exceeded by a substantial margin—Canada's gross national product in 1970 would be more than \$57,000,000,000.

That's one-third higher than the \$43,000,000,000 worth of goods and services produced by Canadians last year. The bank says there are many favorable factors on the economic horizon—an expected higher rate of family formations than in recent years, a resurgence of capital investment, continued strength in overseas markets for Canadian goods and the cumulative effects of automation and technological changes.

The Canadian Manufacturers Association also tried looking ahead to the future during its 53rd annual meeting in Montreal, 14,000 km. away. That would be equivalent to Canada's present tariff system.

They were received with studied attention from the one hand, some spoke of the possible dislocation of Canadian industry through increased imports, or, on the other, the money that can be earned in other countries by easier trade.

Elsewhere on the business scene, the Canadian Nuclear Association was told that nuclear power plants will be coming into their own within 30 years.

By 1958, the association was told, the nuclear stations in Canada will be providing 24 per cent of the country's electricity spending tens of millions of dollars.

But the delegates' views of what they were told depended on whether they belonged to the more-protection or the free-trade parties.

June Output Of U.S. Steel Expected High

CLEVELAND (AP) - With production of this year supported by a high rate of consumption from existing mills, U.S. steel mills will maintain high production schedules in June at a higher level than during June of last year, steel says.

The holding of consumer inventories on the short end of another factor supporting steel production, the metal working weekly explains in this week's issue.

"Last year a big drop in output occurred in the second quarter through July, following completion of a buildup in consumer inventories in the first half of the 1964 model year runs out, but the impact on the steel market is likely to be less severe until late in the month, the magazine says.

It adds that June steel production is expected to push the year average to 61,000,000 net tons. Scrap prices are reflecting dealer buildups in anticipation of strong steelmaking demand, the publication says. Its price composite on No. 1 heavy melting grade of steelmaking scrap was up 33 cents to \$39 a gross ton last week, a year ago it was \$27.83.

The Dow Jones industrial average took a slight loss of 31 at 820.56. The Associated Press average declined 8 to 306.0. Texas Gulf Sulphur, the lone runner of the vogue for mineral stocks with discoveries, ended the week with a loss of 1/4 at 54 1/2 after a considerable fluctuation. It traded 64,100 shares.

U.S. steel typified the strength of its group, rising 2 1/2 to 36 1/2.
