Rapid Gain in Weight Result Of Milk-Feeding

An average gain in weight of three pounds in forty days as a result of milk-feeding, was recorded in Jesse Ketchum, Toronto, where 48 under-nourished children were given half a pint of milk twice a day.

The milk was given at the morning and afternoon recess periods.

The greatest individual gain was 8 1/4 pounds.

A marked improvement in appearance, disposition, interest and ability was noticed as a result of the milk diet.

understood and misinterpreted. The Leader of the Government has made a speech. The motion to go into committee, as laid down in Bourinot, is a mere formal motion and it generally passes like all such motions. I will not say that the Leader of the Government is technically wrong in making a speech such as he did at this stage; and I think it would be most injurious to him and unfair to this House that I should discuss with the Prime Minister of this Province the questions which have been raised during the course of that speech; but it would simply ask Mr. Speaker, in all generosity and as I said from principles of humanity—that the motion be put to the House as to whether or not we shall go into committee upon this bill and deal with it in the proper way. If there is anything wrong with any of the clauses they can be eliminated. But Mr. Speaker, in the name of Providence, do let us—LET US get into committee and let us see if there is anything wrong with the bill.

MR. STEWART: Is that Providence, Rhode Island? (Laughter.)

HON. MR. JOHNSTON: The Prime Minister of Prince Edward Island says that he is not opposed to the appointment of a fourth judge on the Supreme Court
