THE Toronto Globe commissioner's portrayal of the condition of the peasantry of County Donegal reveals a condition of affairs which it is difficult for Canadians to realize can exist in a civilized country in the second half of the nineteenth century. MUCH excitement has been caused in Sydney by the reported discovery at Upper Temora of an immensely rich reef, which is estimated to yield 1,000 oz. to the ton. One small piece, which was crushed, yielded 7 1/2 oz., and of the remaining 20 lb. weight of stone, which was taken from the reef, nearly all was gold.

THE LASH.—In addressing the Grand Jury, at the opening of the General Sessions of the Peace, in Montreal on the 1st inst., Judge Dugas said the list for the past six months showed that illness and drink were at the bottom of nearly all the crimes committed during that time. There was a certain class of loafers in that community, who did not work except when compelled by hunger to do so, and these men were the principal offenders. He gave it as his opinion that the sending of such offenders to jail had not the slightest effect upon them in the way of reform. The question of using the lash for certain offences, had been discussed, and he had no doubt that if its use were adopted, at the discretion of the Judge, it would have a very salutary effect.

THE steamer "Sardinian," with English mail, arrived at Halifax yesterday. She encountered terrific gales during the whole passage. The Halifax "Herald" says:—"She left Liverpool November 23rd, and the voyage commenced with a strong westerly gale, at five a. m., of the 24th, when the mails and the balance of the troops were embarked, and sailed at 6.30 o'clock. On Tuesday, the 6th inst., from that time until Tuesday, the 6th inst., the steamer encountered nothing but a continual succession of N. W. and S. W. gales, with tremendous seas, accompanied with hard squalls. A passing r states that the steamer was tossed and tumbled about like a small boat in a gale. The ship was kept under easy steam, and received no damage. The 1st day's run was fifty-two miles, which was made on the 30th ult. On Tuesday, at 11.30 o'clock, the "Sardinian" signalled Cape Race, and received a reply. She was off Halifax at ten o'clock Wednesday night, but had to keep sounding owing to dense fog."
