Attendance Records Reach New High At Old Home Week Races

Attendance records soared to new heights at the Exhibition Raceway during yesterday when an estimated total of 18,000 racing fans crowded the seating and grounds facilities overflowing at the afternoon and evening meets. Between nine and ten thousand were on hand for the afternoon program while the night performance was considered only to be about a thousand less.

The calibre of racing also reached the pinnacle of entertainment and outstanding racing when following the top-notch card on the matinee program that produced winning times down to the 2:09 mark, the evening performance was no less in the way of excitement although the times were a bit slower in keeping with the classes that were featured.

Although not so fast, it was kept every yard that was travelled over an ideal dirt track in nine thrilling one-mile dash events.

Another individual horse record was awarded during the meet, to run the records behind Bestie for the day, two having gone by the boards during the afternoon sessions.

Reduces Record

Facing the mile to 2:12 in the opening dash of the Jenkins Pharmacy Classified Pace, Walter Kelly's Johnny Kalmuck reduced his record by a liberal two and two-fifths seconds in a changing battle over the mile route with Jerry Lee Volo and Quick Lick, that finally ended with Johnny showing his front of the other two waiting horses in that order at the wire.

It was the Michael Jabalee-owned horse from Sydney that was the big winner of the division from then on when Jabalee himself piloted his Jerry Lee Volo to two wins in the other two dashes in those wins, over Johnny, Quick Lick and Valley Long who all challenged his leadership continually.

The other consistent winner of the night was Miss Playfair, when after coming to the wire fourth in the first dash of the Henderson and Cudmore Classified Pace, over driver Willard Kelly brought him through in the final clutch down the stretch for wins in the second and third dashes. Hilda Mac, with Emmett Bernard in the sulky, was the big winner of the opening dash and was a leading contender in the two latter events behind Bestie Budlong who clipped off place honors in all three dashes with Leo Collins doing the reining.

In the Jack Cameron Classified Pace, there was nothing out and dried between the closely matched seven-horse field, with the winning honors being split as much as was possible, three horses chalking up victories.

All three events were battles that were undecided over practically the full distance, with entries that weren't in it at the finish line setting the top horses to set the pace over most of the route. Joandale, Blaz Dillon and Senator Cragmyle did most of the pace-setting only to suffer defeats in the last quarters when Peterkin Aubrey, Queney Dewey and Cumberland Scott blazed past them for the win positions.

Peterkin Aubrey, owned by Arnett Bell of Carleton Siding, was the top horse in the first dash of the division with Mr. Pettigrew the winning driver, while it was Cumberland Scott in the middle dash when Harold Stead brought the Johnson-owned, Parramore N. S., entry first to the wire. It was a strong last half mile drive by Queney Dewey in the final dash that made the final split-up for the winning honors in the division, owner H. S. Horsemens of Coverdale, N. B., bringing Queney home for the victory.

Louis-Charles Fight Slated For Sept. 27

NEW YORK, Aug. 17 (AP)—Managers of Joe Louis and Edgard Charles agreed by phone today to pit their respective battlers for the world heavyweight championship Sept. 27 at Yankee Stadium.

Louis, the 36-year-old great who surrendered the crown 18 months ago, will receive 36 per cent of the net receipts to apply on his income tax argument with the Federal Government.

Charles, who won recognition in 47 states as the new champion by outpointing Jersey Joe Walcott June 25, 1948. He was runner-up at Chicago, settled for 20 per cent.

It is not recorded that any champion ever before accepted the short end of the purse in a title fight. Charles was not left with much of a talking point after his unimpressive 14-round victory over Freddie Besnore Tuesday night in Buffalo.

Eddie Egan, chairman of the New York Athletic Commission said the winner of the Sept. 27 engagement will be recognized as champion in New York state which hasn't had a standard-bearer since Louis went into his temporary retirement.

Egan earlier had insisted upon a showdown between Charles and Lee Savold, the British-recognized world champion, but relented when Louis announced his comeback.

While James D. Norris, president of the International Boxing Corporation, ironed out all pertinent details in today's long-distance talks with the interested managers, the bout will not become "official" until the two Negro fighters ink the contracts before the local commission.

Outside of exhibitions, the fight will be Louis' first since he knocked out Joe Walcott at the Stadium June 25, 1948. He announced March 1 last year that he was through after 11 years at the top.

Despite the long lay-off, local bookmakers are offering 3 to 1 that the old champion knocks the wading out of Charles.

(By The Canadian Press) TORONTO, Aug. 17—Bobby Gray, long-hitting Toronto professional, fired a scorching three-under-par 69 today to take the lead at the end of the first 18 holes of the Ontario Open golf championship.

Gray put together nine-hole scores of 33 and 36 to move two strokes ahead of the pack. The veteran pro at the suburban Scarborough Course is a two-time winner of the open title.

A field of 120 teed off today in the hunt for the stepped-up \$2,000 purse over the par-72 St. George's Club.

Behind Gray with 71's were Bobby Fair, 20-year-old Toronto amateur; Bob Dean, 21-year-old unattached Toronto pro and Jerry Proulx of the Montreal Bonnie Brook Club.

The defending champion, Nick Westlock, a Windsor, Ont., amateur came home with 72. Pat Fletcher, Saskatoon, had a 72.

Three top-ranking favorites—Dick Metz of Virginia Beach, Va., Stan Leonard of Vancouver Marine Drive, and Jules Huot of Montreal Laval—all shot 73's.

A last-minute entry, Bill Ezinicki, Toronto Maple Leafs hockey star, shot a 74.

Scott Spencer, Lock Hanover Share Honors In Free-For-All Event

Despite a 20-minute downpour of rain that cut a third off the big Thursday afternoon Old Home Week racing program, highlighted by the Moore & MacLeod Free-For-All Pace, the six one-mile dash events came up with some thrilling racing before the largest attendance to be recorded this season, an estimated total of 9,000 to 10,000.

The unfinished dashes of each event on yesterday afternoon's card will be completed this afternoon at one o'clock prior to the big nine-dash program that is also scheduled this afternoon.

Scott Spencer, the Harry Hirsch-owned pacer from Sydney, N. S., and Lock Hanover, owned by Bart Yerna of Sussex, N. B., held the spotlight for winning honors in the free-for-all pace with an even split on the two dashes run off in that division. Both came up with identical times, the mile in 2:09, equalling the fastest time recorded this season over an Island track, first set by Lock Hanover in winning the Junior Free-For-All Pace in the opening meet of Old Home Week on Monday night.

Driven by Mr. Harrison, Scott Spencer started his winning drive, in the first dash of the division from a fourth horse position on the backstretch going to the three quarter pole to overtake the field, then lead by Lock Hanover, by the time the five-eighth mark had been reached.

From there he came down the stretch with a burst of speed right through the centre for an exciting win. Gay Law and Vella LaVella, who also started their drives in the backstretch from rear positions, also headed the rest of the field down the home stretch for the place and show positions respectively.

It was a different story in the second dash, which incidentally was the last one before the rains came, when Claude O'Brien took Lock Hanover right to the front at the first turn from a starting fifth position, and although throwing off repeated challenges by Victory Dale, Carl Frisco and Vella LaVella, stayed on top right to the finish wire. It was a terrific three-horse finish with Vella and Victory Dale finishing close behind in that order.

With Don Seaman doing the piloting of Just Brenda, the slick little pacer from the Justamere Stables City, came up with two top-notch performances to score victories in both of the dashes run in the Hambley and Innis Classified pace, setting a new record for herself in the opening dash of the meet with a time of 2:14 3-5. Although closely pressed by C. Albert Budlong and Marjorie Budlong, coming down to the wire in the first to place second and third in that order, the local pacer was never headed over the mile route. It was a tougher battle, however, in the second dash of the division. With Albert C. Budlong going away in front at the first turn only to have Marjorie take the lead at the one-eighth pole, Brenda had to start her drive from just past the halfway mark from a sixth-horse position. Overhauling horses one by one, Seaman had his Brenda in third place by the backstretch, and came out from there at the seven-eighth marker to come home a winner in a driving finish with C. Albert and Marjorie.

John Clegg, owned by B. C. Cruickshanks of Halifax, N. S., with Angie Allen handling the ribbons, also came up with a record breaking performance in the R. T. Morrison Classified Pace event. Clipping off both dashes for top honors in the division, John lowered his record to 2:13 1-5 in the first dash, which came up with one of two leading finishes that were the most outstanding for closeness of the meet. The Clegg horse came from a number two position behind Ma Cherie at the outside and Ma Cherie on the rail in a rousing blanket finish that

took in nearly every horse in the field, that took a photo to decide the first three horses, Commando second and Ma Cherie third.

His second win was also a blanket finish to the wire when Alles pulled him out for the drive on the backstretch from fourth place behind Starlight Eclipse, Calumet Onward and Miss Commando, to get into the lead over Starlight at the upper turn. It was a battle over every inch of the home stretch between Starlight, Ma Cherie and the Clegg pacer, the latter getting the winning nod while Starlight got the place position over Ma Cherie after a photo decided the issue.
