U. S. Conditions May Hit Synthetic Textiles Here

MONTREAL (CP) — The Canadian synthetic textile industry may be seriously affected by "a sharp turn for the worse" in the affairs of the United States fabric producers.

President Gerald L. Bruck of the Canadian Silk and Rayon Institute said Monday.

"Some large U.S. producers," said Mr. Bruck in an interview, "have been forced to curtail production operations to four days a week because of inability to market their outputs even at distress prices. This could easily mean increased unloadings of cloth in Canada."

Mr. Bruck, also president of Bruck Mills Limited, said Canadian synthetic cloth mills "are already under heavy pressure from an unprecedented volume of imports."

"Thousands of yards of fabrics remained unsold this spring at a time when producers should have been moving into spring and summer stocks."

SHIPMENTS DOWN — In the first three months of this year, he said Canadian mills shipped about 23,000,000 yards of synthetics, compared with 25,000,000 yards in the first quarter of 1955.

"This was very disappointing because business even at distress prices in 1955 from the low levels of 1954 and we were hoping the trend would continue," he said.

The modest improvement in the sales of Canadian synthetic cloths in 1955 from the low level of 1954 was accomplished at insignificant or no profit margins for manufacturers, Mr. Bruck said.

"Five years ago about 10 per cent of the Canadian synthetic fabric markets were filled by imports, but this figure now is about 27 per cent. In this period Canadian mills have been forced to lay off more than 3,000 workers."

He said Canadian producers are not pessimistic about the future of the industry despite the recession of recent years. "The industry has a tremendous future throughout the world, and the Canadian industry, with a little government aid, could take its rightful place in this development."
