SOUTHAMPTON CENTENIAL

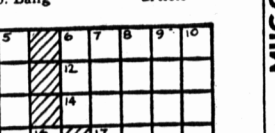

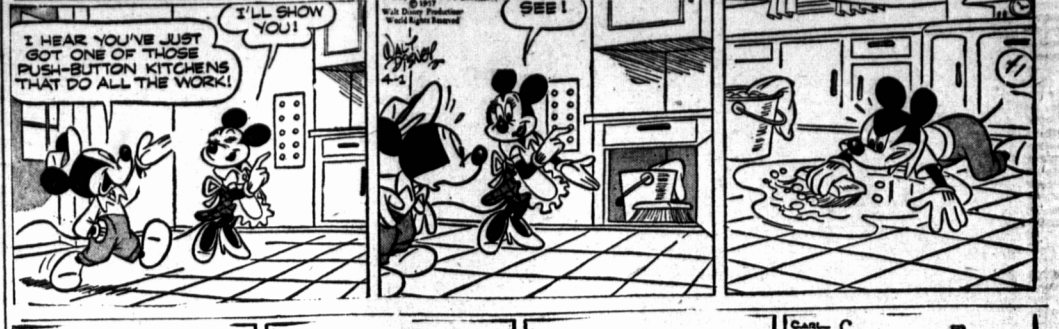
