

FURTHER PROGRESS OF DISESTABLISHMENT IN THE HOUSE OF LORDS.

London, July 18, 1869. The latest despatch from the Great Eastern dated 9 o'clock yesterday, was as follows: "We are going to cut the cable and blow." This has evidently been done, for no signals have passed since. A careful watch is being kept for a renewal of the signals.
