CHINESE TELETYPE

TAIPEI, Formosa (Reuters)— A new teletype machine transmitting Chinese characters will go into service here on New Year's Day, it was announced Monday. The Taiwan (Formosa) Telecommunications Bureau said the machine could transmit characters or words a minute. Under the present system, using code numbers, only about 20 to 25 words can be transmitted each minute.
