Summerside Air Cadet On His Way To Visit In The United Kingdom

This morning Warrant Officer Charles Simpson, son of Dr. and Mrs. J. C. Simpson, Summerside, leaves for Aylmer, Ont., to join a group of air cadets from across Canada who have been chosen to make this year's exchange visit to The United Kingdom. W. O. Simpson represents this Province for the 1951 trip.

At Aylmer, he will also be presented with his air cadet wings for which he qualified on a recent 18 day course at Moncton, N. B. He completed 17 hours flying and 60 hours of ground training. He took his first solo flight last Thursday.

While in The United Kingdom the 26 Canadian air cadets will be received by Their Majesties the King and Queen at Balmoral Castle on August 19th, the royal reception will highlight a three week tour which is part of the International Air Cadet Exchange Plan sponsored in Canada by the Air Cadet League and the R.C.A.F.

Selected on a merit basis from all parts of Canada, the cadets will climb aboard an R.C.A.F. North Star on Wednesday, August 1st.

Rev. Mr. Fraser was succeeded by the following ministers: Rev. A. F. Carr (1871-1889); Rev. J. K. Fraser (1891-1898); Rev. H. G. Gratz (1899-1906); Rev. George Millar (1907-1919); Rev. G. A. Christie (1920-1925); Rev. W. M. Morrison (1927-1928); Rev. J. K. Fraser, D.D. (1931-1936).

For a number of years the congregation was served by student supply. Some of these, now ordained and serving in various parts of Canada are: Rev. John C. Rev. George B. Cunningham, the present minister, was inducted in 1948.
