More French In Civil Service Advocated By Prime Minister

OTTAWA (CP)—The services of government "should be available to citizens in their own language," Prime Minister Pearson said here in advocating wider use of French in the civil service.

"Mr. Pearson, speaking at a dinner of the Professional Institute that ultimately it will be possible for any officer of the public service to deal with at least some of his superiors in his own language, said he will not be in a position where he must always use the language with which he is less familiar than his own. He hopes that ultimately the most senior officers in all branches of the public service will be able to handle there are large areas of Canada where such knowledge is essential."

CNR Deficit Is Reduced

OTTAWA (CP)—The CNR had a deficit of \$38,700,000 last year, its lowest since 1957, the Senate's transportation committee was told.

The figure was made public for the first time as CNR executive officers replied to questioning about a bill authorizing the railway's expenditures to next June 30.

The publicly-owned railway made a profit of about \$20,000,000 on its actual operations during 1964, a sharp improvement, but went into the red after paying the interest charges on its massive debt structure. This interest now runs around \$60,000,000 a year.

No other details of the financial year were reported. These will come in the railway's annual report to Parliament later this year.

In 1963 the CNR lost \$43,000,000. The deficit figure has been declining steadily since 1961.

The bidding shown occurred at Table No. 1, where the defending champions were North-South. The East-West pair were playing there by accident. They belonged at Table No. 1, but in a different section.

Since they had started to bid the hand before the error was discovered, the East-West pair were penalized by the tournament director by being compelled to play it against the reigning champions. This proved to
