A Prosperous Decade.

In 1881 there were in Canada twelve cities and towns with a manufacturing output of over \$2,000,000; in 1891 there were 22. In 1881 there were eight cities and towns with an output of over \$3,000,000; in 1891 the number had increased to 14. In 1881 seven cities reported an output of over \$5,000,000, and in 1891 nine made this report. In 1881 two cities returned over \$10,000,000 worth of manufactured products, and in 1891 there were four cities with this record. In 1881 the highest reporting was Montreal with \$52,500,000 output; the next highest is Toronto, having \$19,500,000 output. In 1891 Montreal reported over \$72,500,000, and Toronto over \$45,000,000 worth.

News Notes.

Icebergs are still reported in the vicinity of Belle Isle. Oxford county, Ont., farmers expect 40 bushels of wheat to the acre. The situation in the Idaho mining districts is so satisfactory that nearly all the United States troops ordered there to suppress riots have been withdrawn. Fifty sunstrokes have been reported to the police of New York and 202 deaths. This is 40 over the average. Michael Torpey, 46 years, of East 20th Street, was crazed by the heat and jumped from a fifth story window to the ground and will die. The coal combination in the United States is squeezing the fat out of the consumer without mercy. Since January last the price of stove coal has been advanced \$1.05, and of chestnut coal \$1.30 per ton, and this without any increase in the cost of production or of transportation. The lever has been worked simply by a combination of the companies controlling the Pennsylvania fields, and it seems doubtful that any effective remedy can be applied. Canadians, being dependent on the United States for their supply of anthracite coal, are also made to feel the turn of the screw.

The Great St. Peter's Cathedral, Montreal, is rapidly approaching completion. It is probable, from present appearances, that the first Mass will be celebrated there about the 15th of next November. The interior of the massive edifice already presents an impressive appearance. The height of the cupola is 200 feet and the diameter 80 feet, while the interior length of the whole edifice is 320 feet. The vault and cornices are of white pine gilded and painted in white, and the interior walls are of fire proof cement. The paintings of the principle cupola represent the four evangelists with their respective emblems, the eagle for St. John, the winged lion for St. Mark, and the winged ox for St. Luke. In addition to the angels designed above the evangelists, there are also completed at the base of the cupola representations of the keys of St. Peter, the arms of Pope Leo XIII., the arms of Bishop Bourget and the arms of Archbishop Fabre. The paintings in the vault of the apse represent in the centre the collection or gift of the keys to St. Peter, at the right the miraculous fishing and at the left Christ meeting St. Peter leaving Rome. This massive structure has already cost about half a million dollars, and before it is completed, which is expected in 1895, will probably have exceeded the million.

Crisp and Casual.

Arkansas has a wonderful onyx cave in the Ozark mountains. The modern panorama is due to Micheli du Crest, a Frenchman. The reign of the dog star lasts for forty days, from July 3 to August 1. The first jaguan was brought to the United States about fifty years ago. The Shah and the Sultan each possess a mat made of pearls and diamonds valued at over \$2,500,000. A London publisher is going to reproduce the first folio 1623 edition of Shakespeare by means of photography. A tribal law in Mashena, Central Africa, decrees the death of twin babies by drowning immediately after they are born. The Carson City (Nev.) Appeal says that a little insect that fastens itself on the wire fences in the fall and exudes a sticky, glutinous substance is often responsible for broken fences. Siberia signifies "thirsty." Sicily is the "country of grapes." Caledonia means "a high hill." Asia signifies "in the middle," from the fact that ancient geographers thought it between Europe and Africa. Italy signifies "a country of pitch," from the fact that it yields great quantities of black pitch. Hibernia is "utmost" or "last habitation." Britain is the country of tin, great quantities being found in it.

HORSES TO THE UNITED STATES.—At present Canadian horses may be taken into the United States free of duty for racing or show purposes, on a bond that the horses will be returned to Canada within six months. It appears that the law has not been complied with, and that many Canadian horses which get into the States by this means are sold without paying any duty. This having come to the knowledge of the United States secretary of the treasury, he has ordered that the penalty of the bond for the return of the horses be exacted in future.

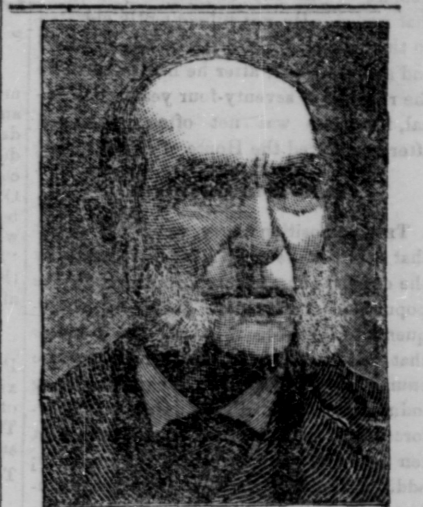
