AND BAG LIMITS

**HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE:** Oct. 1st to November 11th. Bag limit five birds per day.

**RUFFED GROUSE OR NATIVE PARTRIDGE:** Oct. 15th to Oct. 31st. Bag limit three birds per day.

**PHEASANTS:** Oct. 1st to Nov. 11th. Bag limit three birds per day including not more than one hen pheasant in the Counties of Kings, Queens and Prince east of Summerside.

**HARES OR RABBITS:** Nov. 1st to Jan. 31st.

**MUSKRATS:** Nov. 10th to Dec. 31st.

**MINK:** Nov. 10th to Dec. 31st.

**RACCOON:** Jan. 1st to Dec. 31st.

**MIGRATORY BIRDS**

**DUCKS:** (Other than Wood Ducks), Oct. 1st to Dec. 9th. Bag limit 8 (exclusive of Mergansers) per day.

**GEESE:** (Other than Brant), October 1st to Dec. 9th. Bag Limit five (including Brant), per day.

**BRANT:** Oct. 29th to Nov. 27th. Bag limit five including geese per day.

**WILSON SNIPES:** Oct. 1st to Nov. 2nd. Bag limit 4 per day.

**WOODCOCK:** Oct. 1st to Nov. 2nd. Bag limit 8 per day.

## SPORT FORUM

### Ever Hear Of Wallach?

Sir,—Ever hear of Dr. Louis Wallach—chances are you never did—but the name Leach Cross will ring a bell especially among the older fighter fans. Wallach whose ring name was Leach Cross died recently in New York. Oldtimers will tell you that Cross was a terrific puncher. The same ring wise people who followed the sport in all its aspects will also tell you that Leach Cross was one of the cleverest Lightweight that ever laced on a pair of leather mitts. He was the first boxer to draw large crowds by making them dislike him. Cross often said that half of the fight mob would flock to the arenas to see him get killed and the other half would go to bury him.

Cross looked more like a cautious, thin and emaciated looking. He fooled spectators and opponents alike, into thinking a slight breeze would blow him down and out. At first the fans resented being crossed by Cross, who disappointed everybody

but himself by winning. It didn't take the fans long to realize however that Cross always gave them a run for their money, and that for or against him he provided thrills either way.

The Ring Record Book uses almost two pages to list the fights engaged in by Cross from 1906 to 1921. Cross 5 feet 7½ inches and weighing 135 lbs. was born February 12, 1886, in Ridge St. in the heart of New York's teeming tenement district, unlike most kids who entered the prize ring from the neighborhood he was neither a bully nor a leader of a street gang. He learned to fight protecting himself from attack by gangs on the way to and from City College, where he received his education in Academic and Dentistry.

Cross began fighting at clubs near his home in order to gather a little extra cash. There was one big draw back at the start, Leach's parents were against ed out to study boxing scientifically. His early efforts to defend himself were noteworthy because his desire to remain unmarked sprang from his eagerness to keep his parents from learning of his ring activities. So well did Cross master the science of boxing in addition to developing murderous punching power in each hand that he emerged from each ring engagement with scarcely a hair out of place. In his first fight he knocked out Bob Waters in 1906 and fought nearly 200 fights between then and 1921 meeting the best, champions and near champions. His toughest fight was with fighting Dick Hyland who stopped him in 41 rounds at Colma, California.

However Cross developed enough to defeat a long list of truly great fighters—Mexican Joe Rivers one of the best lightweights that ever lived. Maty Baldwin, Ab Walrus, K.O. Brown, Packy McFarland. With the exception of Dick Hyland, Gilbert Gallant born in Bloomfield, P.E.I. gave Cross more trouble than any of the all-time greats that he faced in his career. In four outings against Gallant the best he could do was get two draws and come out on the losing end twice by decision. From the records it appears Cross kept in shape by fighting and without discrimination in the matter of opponents. He was a fighting dentist who never pulled his punches.

### 10 COMMANDMENTS OF SAFETY

1. Treat every gun with the deepest respect due to a loaded gun. This is the cardinal rule of gun safety.
2. Carry only empty guns, taken down or with the action open, into your automobile, camp and home.
3. Always be sure that the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.
4. Always carry your gun so that you can control the direction of the muzzle even if you stumble.
5. Always be sure of your target before pulling the trigger.
6. Never point a gun at anything you do not want to shoot.
7. Never leave your gun unattended unless you unload it first.
8. Never climb a tree or a fence with a loaded gun.
9. Never shoot at a flat hard surface or the surface of water.
10. Do not mix gunpowder and alcohol.
