Adventists Open Annual Appeal Today

The annual Ingathering Appeal to help support and extend worldwide mission work, is being launched today by the Seventh-day Adventist church here, according to W. M. Mercer, pastor. Observing the 50th year since the national beginning of the appeal, the local church plans to reach its \$1000 goal this year in two weeks through member and business firm contributions and door-to-door solicitation. The amount raised last year was approximately \$1100, church officials report.

On a national scale last year's Appeal netted \$3,335,000, virtually all of which went directly into humanitarian work, it is reported. Deductions for administrative expense was nil, since projects supported from Ingathering funds are administered by existing church organizations with income derived elsewhere.

Besides public subscription Adventist members themselves last year gave more than \$52,000,000 for support of a program of missions, medical, and educational work in 194 countries.

Welfare work is conducted on a local and a national scale. Adventists in the Dominion helped over 10,908 families with over 5,508 hampers of food and 35,771 articles of clothing at a cost of \$83,613 in 1951 through their Welfare Societies.

Other projects in Canada and foreign countries include 165 hospitals, clinics, and dispensaries, employing 2,822 doctors and nurses, as well as 4,438 schools and colleges. In many areas these are the only medical and educational institutions working for backward peoples.

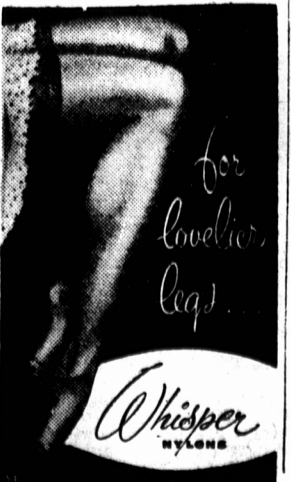
"Christian missions at home and abroad have always been one of the most powerful forces for enlightening backward peoples," Pastor Mercer said in announcing this year's drive. "Millions of persons are being helped to help themselves," he added. "This is the effective way to build solidly for a more progressive free world."

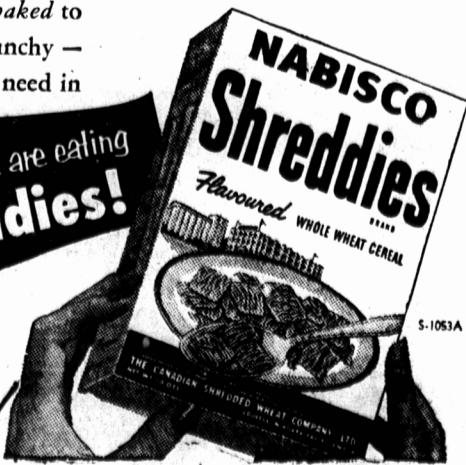
