OBITUARY

GEORGE F. TAYLOR (inserted by the family)

The death occurred suddenly on July 5, 1966 at his home, 26 Rochford Street of George F. Taylor. Born in Carbonara, New Brunswick on September 1, 1888, he was the eldest son of the late Willis and Helena Horwood Taylor. At an early age he came with his parents to Charlottetown, where the family has since resided.

At the outbreak of war in 1914, he enlisted with the original 26th Battalion and saw active service until his discharge in 1918, having been wounded twice. For a number of years he was in the employ of the Canadian National Steamships and in the Second World War served with the American Merchant Marine, being torpedoed on two occasions. Always kind and considerate of others, his amodest and unassuming manner won the respect of all who knew him.

He leaves to mourn a brother Joseph and a sister Gladys, both of Charlottetown, a sister, Mary, and a brother Harry predeceased him. The funeral was held from the MacLean Funeral Home on July 7th. The service was conducted by Rev. Gerald Wyrwas assisted by Rev. Allison MacLean. Burial was in Floral Hills Memorial Gardens, where a Legion Service was held under the direction of Mr. Harry Mortimer, Rev. Neville and Last Post were rendered by Bugler William Blanchard. Pallbearers were Warren Houston, Harry Drew, Jack Connolly, Harry Mortimer, Capt. John A. MacDonald and Clifford Moore.

Army troops helped crush that outburst and the Communists next turned in July, to the northern state of Uttar Pradesh attempting to embarrass both the local and state governments. Many lives were lost and property worth millions destroyed.

ELBOWED AWAY

Opposition parties simmer in frustration because they have been elbowed away from the political through since independence. Mrs. Gandhi's party, striving to maintain its identity as the dragon-killer that vanquished British colonialism, keeps a hold on public posts of consequence.

For the first time, the Congress party is campaigning for a general election without the guiding hand of Mrs. Gandhi's father Jawaharlal Nehru. In the old days he alone could assure resounding victory and party unity. Now the party is old and tired, split by factional quarrels.
