THE BIRTHPLACE OF BURNS.

Considerable alterations are in course of being carried out at the birthplace of Robert Burns, known as "Burns Cottage, at Alloway. It is intended to remove a hall attached to the back of the cottage, used as a museum and temperance refreshment room, and to transfer the Burns relics from this to a new and larger hall in a range of cottage buildings which have just been completed within the grounds attached to the cottage. The caretaker and his family, who inhabit part of the cottage, have also been provided with accommodation in the new buildings. The cottage will thus be restored as far as possible to its original condition. The trustees, in resolving to make the alterations, were principally actuated by the desire to reduce the risk to the buildings from fire to a minimum, and with this end in view all fires and artificial lighting appliances will be removed, and the heating of the cottage will be from the hot-water system in the new buildings. A new turnstile will be put up opening into the grounds, which extend to seven acres, and access to the cottage will be from the grounds. The new buildings are ready for occupation, and it is intended that the alterations shall be completed during the present winter. It may be noted that when the new arrangements come into force no refreshments will be sold within the precincts.

KITCHENER IN COMMAND:

He Will Fight the Boers in Their Own Way.

LONDON, November 6.--Lord Roberts, according to despatches from Cape Town, has taken his sick daughter to Johannesburg, and Lord Kitchener is left in command. It seems likely that he will have plenty of work. General DeWet is reported to have made his appearance near Frankfort, in the north-eastern corner of Orange River Colony, and small bodies of Boers continue harassing tactics.

It is asserted that Lord Kitchener intends to stop the pursuit of commandoes and to try to settle the colonies by garrisoning and organizing the towns for rapid raids with mounted troops.

On the return to England of some soldiers from South Africa, London was moved by a cyclone of enthusiasm which drove before it the great mass of humanity, counted by millions, like feathers in a storm. A cordon of soldiers and police broke before the impetuosity of the moving millions, at a thousand points. It was to no purpose that the military cordon, whose business it was to keep the line open, linked hands and stood back to back assisting the police; the rush of the mass of people swept both police and military as easily as a hurricane drives into billows the water of the ocean. The line of the swaying multitude, meeting counter currents here and there, became a solid mass, which held so fast together, that not even the weight of mounted horsemen could make any impression upon it. For once, a London crowd became unmanageable; but it was good natured, though terribly in earnest in its approval of the course that has been pursued in South Africa.
