

IN MEMORIAM

MR. WILLIAM HENRY GREEN

On Wednesday morning, January 24th, 1951, death came to one of Hampshire's oldest residents, Mr. William Henry Green. Although in declining years his passing came suddenly and unexpectedly to his family and friends.

Mr. Green was born at Stanhope, P. E. I. July 10th, 1884, was the eldest son of Peter Green and Elizabeth Bowman. He spent his early years on the Glasgow Road where he married Eugenia Florence Wilson. Later with his family came to Kingston as a farmer.

Mr. Green had spent a number of years at the work of his choice a carpenter, and had only given up this work two years ago. He was always active in church work and for many years was a member of the Methodist Church, later the United Church of Canada and even at his great age was a regular attendant at the different places of worship.

There are left to mourn, his widow, two daughters, Mrs. May Willis and Mrs. Owen Younker of Kingston; ten grand children are left to cherish the memory of one worthy of example. There are also fifteen great grand children. One son Robert Hampson predeceased him nineteen years ago. In passing he also left his youngest brother George who at the close of the funeral service suddenly passed away.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. Howard Christie assisted by Rev. M. K. Charman, Rev. Donald Nicholson sang "No Disappointment in Heaven". Hymns sung were "I Love Thy Kingdom Lord" and "Never Further Than Thy Cross." The pallbearers were Elmer Willis, Merrill Green, Harrison Green, Elmer Younker, Willard Proud and Clifford Proud.

He was laid to rest in the Kingston Cemetery where the burial service of the Orange Association of which he was a valued member was carried out.

MR. W. S. MUTTART

There passed away at his home, North Carleton, March 19th, Mr. W. S. Muttart, one of the most respected residents in his 92nd year. He was the son of the late John D. and Mary Jane Leard Muttart.

When very young he became a member of the Methodist Church and later of the United Church, Cape Traverse in which he served faithfully through the years as choir leader and superintendent of the Sunday School for about forty years. He also was church Treasurer, Elder and Trustee for many years. His home work was secondary to that of the Master. His influence for temperance was very strong. His consistent christian life, his high ideals, his conscientious stand for the best things in the church and community and his devotion to duty have been an inspiration to many of the younger generation to bear the torch, that he so nobly carried through life.

In his day of activity he was one of the most progressive farmers. He was a true friend and neighbour. His wife the former Ada Jane Lowther, predeceased him twelve years ago. He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Blanche Harper, one grandson Allison M. Harper, and two great grandsons. He is also survived by two sisters Mrs. Geo. Callbeck, Tryon and Mrs. James Staver, Charlottetown and three brothers Albert, Frank and Hedley of Carleton.

The funeral which was largely attended was held at the home Wednesday, March 21st. An impressive service was conducted by his pastor, Rev. R. Le Bacon, Tryon, assisted by Rev. Burton Crowe and Rev. E. S. Weeks, Bedeque. A solo "The Christians Good Night" was very effectively rendered by Mrs. (Dr.) L. M. Callbeck, Summerside. The hymns sung were "Rock of Ages" and "The Sands of Time are Sinking." The Cape Traverse choir was assisted by members from Borden and Bedeque United Church choirs. Mrs. Ralph B. MacCaull was organist.

The pallbearers were four nephews Major Lowther, Kenneth Muttart, Dr. L. M. Callbeck and John Muttart; also John S. Haslam and Sheldon Dixon. Interment was in Cape Traverse United Church Cemetery.
