Hindu Priests Foresee Threat  
NEW DELHI (AP) — Hundreds of Hindu priests chanted Sanskrit verses from sacred books today in an effort to avert destruction of the human race. Hindu astrologers say such a catastrophe is imminent because the eight planets will be in the sign of Capricorn next February.  
In tents beside the Jumna River at New Delhi priests from all over India took part in efforts to prevent world disaster or at least minimize human suffering.  
By Jan. 5 they will have recited one prayer 20,000,000 times and other sacred verses uncounted times and will have offered more than 1,000,000 sacrifices of rice and butter in honor of the sun god.  
The astrologers say disaster is in the stars because of an inauspicious combination of the planets in Capricorn between Feb. 3 and Feb. 5. Terrible wars ravaged India the last two times such a combination occurred, 5,000 years ago and 800 years ago, astrologers say.  
They predict that things will begin getting bad for the world in January, when they are six planets in Capricorn. On Jan. 24 seven planets will enter the same area of the sky and on Feb. 3 the eighth will join them.  
Some of the predictions include world war, widespread plague and earthquakes that will topple the Himalayas.
