Georgetown Film Council Meets

The annual meeting of the Georgetown Film Council was held on Wednesday, May 20th, in the Legion Hall. Eight members and two visitors were present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted. The treasurer's report showed that all associations represented in the Council excepting two have made an initial donation for the projector, and those remaining are prepared to make their donation in the near future. The projector has been used quite extensively since its arrival in the community, and the school especially has felt the benefit of such a stimulating medium as is provided by visual education.

There followed the business appointment of officers for the ensuing year. The Rev. Mr. Peterson was voted to the position of president. Mr. Howard MacDonald was elected vice-president. Mr. J. B. Scully became secretary; Mrs. Spurgeon Walker, treasurer; and Mrs. Edward Easton, librarian.

Mr. McInnis of the National Film Board was present, and gave the council many helpful suggestions. He also announced that the N. F. B. has now received a Post Office franchise from the government which means all film may be returned to headquarters free of charge. Mr. McInnis stressed the importance of filling out programme report cards for every film showing, as these cards are sent directly to Ottawa, and determine the budget provided for new films and other improvements the following year.

Some discussion was held on the membership fee to be set annually for the member association. Mr. J. B. Scully moved that an annual fee of \$3 be paid by each member group, effective in 1954, and such dues to be paid by the annual meeting. This was seconded by Mr. H. MacDonald and the motion was carried.

The president called the next meeting of the film council for July. The meeting then adjourned. —CK
