

Student Council Discusses Strike, Personnel, Budgets

Last Sunday night's Council meeting which consisted basically of an agenda of only three items took over three and didn't finish the third.

Student Union, after many hassles and many irrelevant "points" voted to support the maintenance workers in their quest for higher wages. Finally they came up with the following stand:

Last night during the bi-monthly meeting of the University of Prince Edward Island Student Union Council, representatives of the striking maintenance workers met with the Council to determine Student Union support of the striking workers. Mr. Phil Fleming and Mr. Everett Baker, both of the IBEW, discussed and clarified the stand the striking workers are now taking. The Council was assured that the needs of the residence students would be respected in that the striking workers would not interfere with the heating and food necessities of these students.

After much active debate, the Student Union Council voted to the striking workers of the maintenance department their full moral support. It was also decided education of the student body and any other interested persons in conjunction with a number of sympathetic faculty members should be held. Therefore commencing today, Monday, a study session will be held in the Robertson Library student's lounge at 1:00p.m. Sessions will be continued on Tuesday and on Wednesday a referendum will be presented to entire student body to determine the type of active support that will be given by the students.

The Students Council would urge everyone to become familiar with the worker's demands to evaluate their stand in regards to the Council's support, and to become more aware of the situation before Wednesday's referendum.

While not stated the prime method of support for the workers which appears to be

under consideration for Wednesday's referendum is a class boycott possibly including joining the workers on the strike line. While a large portion of this story will be outdated by the time the Cadre hits the streets, we urge all members of the Student Union to take part in the study sessions and to vote in Wednesday's referendum.

The second major item which was voted upon at the meeting was Personnel Board recommendations. The following is a list of the people who gained positions with the Student Union in the recommendations:

As points of information, Campus police are on 24hr call. It was noted that the Personnel Board gets into events free although they stay in line and their guests pay. A move was made to try and change this situation but it was defeated.

The third major item which was voted upon at the meeting was budgets for the three major committees of the Student Union, The Cadre, the Photo Club, and the Radio Station. Due to the length of time spent on the previous motions the photo club's budget was tabled until the next meeting.

While the Cadre's budget was passed without (much)

argument from either the Council or the newspaper, the Radio Station's met with considerable disapproval. Station Manager Mike Hennessey and Station Engineer Kenny Adams felt that an insufficient amount was allocated by Council towards operating expenditures. Eventually a motion to pass the budgeted figure of \$1000 was defeated 6-6 (ties are lost) and the disputed part of the budget was tabled until Mr. Hennessey submits a more detailed budget to the Finance Committee for re-consideration.

The following are the two budgets which were passed. The disputed part of the CIMN budget is marked with an asterick.

Cadre Budget

The original requested amount by the Members of the Cadre totaled \$8,055.00.

The Finance Committee felt that the potential income for the Cadre should be as follows:

1. Local Ads	\$1,000.00
2. National Ads	2,000.00
3. Paper Sales,	350.00
Total	3,350.00

Since the Finance Committee allocated \$5,000 Student Union funds towards the Cadre, this leaves it with a potential surplus of \$1,310.00.

The cost of moving the Cadre to forth floor Main is not included in this budget as there are presently no forecasted figures for the move. The Finance Committee feels that any cost incurred in this move shall not be applied to this budget as a separate cost projection will be made later.

CIMN Budget

The original requested amount by CIMN Radio total \$7,140.00 After reviewing the budget request the Finance Committee came up with the following figures for Council to approve.

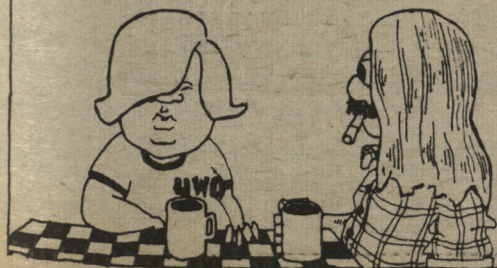
The Finance Committee feels that the potential income for the Radio Station being \$3,000 that the CIMN should be given towards the above costs and that \$3,500 potential advertising revenue be given them making their total potential surplus \$1,970.

The Finance Committee felt that a Broadcast News System which was requested by CIMN radio was not a justified expenditures and should not be purchased as the cost would be about \$2,000 per year.

N.B. The monies mentioned in the above budgets will not be spent for any purpose other than the ones cited.
