Newfoundland—South-east Coast. LIGHTS AT CAPE RACE AND CAPE PINE.

WITH reference to the Notice to Mariners, No. 28, issued from this office on the 12th day of June, 1865, wherein it is stated—"that the fixed light at Cape Race would be altered to a revolving white light; and the revolving light at Cape Pine to a fixed white light"—Mariners are hereby informed that these intended alterations, owing to unforeseen circumstances, have not yet taken place; but due notice will be given of the actual changes, when it is known at what time they can be effected.

The light at Cape Race is at present a fixed white light, and that at Cape Pine a revolving white light.
