Inoculation against cholera is to be continued in Spain. It is estimated that \$200,000 was spent for flowers for the funeral of Victor Hugo. The United States is threatened with another Indian war—an outbreak of the Cheyennes. Bartholdi, the sculptor, whose statue of Liberty has just arrived, in New York, is a native of Alsacia.

It is said that it rains 240 days in the year in Alaska. What it does the other 125 days is not stated, but it probably rains. It is estimated that the average consumption of eggs throughout the United States amounts to 45,000,000 daily.

A short time ago a Kansas sheep-raiser sheared 600 fine sheep; during the night cold rains set in and 400 perished.

During the year lifeboats were launched 252 times, and not one man of their crews was lost.

Then it is pressed upon a ground of heavy paper, which is to be used in the manufacture of "embossed leather." Fashionable people think they are going away back to medieval times when they have the walls of their libraries and dining-rooms, covered with this, and remain in blissful ignorance that the shoes and boots which their neighbors threw into the ash barrel a month before now adorn their walls and hang on the screens which protect their eyes from the fire.

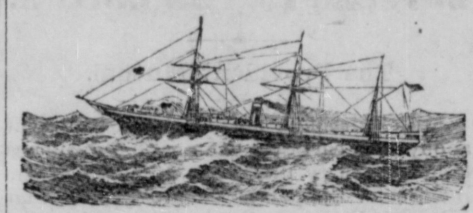
