LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The Proposed City Bill.

Sir,—Although not in sympathy with the movers of the Bill submitted at the Citizens Meeting asking to abolish the Water Commissioners, still I should be sorry to find fault with the Councilors (as did some of the speakers at the public meeting) for the steps taken to reduce the cost of City Government generally; for although I feel satisfied that a very large majority of the tax payers are opposed to the idea of having the management of the waterworks placed in the hands of the City Council, still, I am also well aware of the fact that a large number of persons are of opinion that the time has arrived when the amount paid to the Commissioners should be reduced by at least one half, either by reducing the number of Commissioners to one, or if all three are to be retained, then by allowing them \$300 for their services instead of \$640 as at present. The City Report for 1891, shows the following salaries paid to officials for that year:

I have in view, namely, to point out wherein a very considerable saving might be made with out injury to the public service or the health of the officials. In the first place—Reduce the Water Commissioners' pay by \$300, thus saving..... \$ 300 00
The City Clerk with one good assistant at a salary of \$500, thus saving..... 279 43
The work now performed by the City Clerk, Clerk of W. Coms. and S. M. Clerk, and Clerk of Fire Dept., thus saving to the city..... 917 33
The duties of City Collector and Market Clerk should be amalgamated and salary \$400, thus saving..... 350 00
The duties of City Surveyor and Sanitary Officer could easily be performed by a competent man at a salary of \$500, thus saving..... 279 43
The work now performed by the City Building for the School Board, thus saving..... 100 00
Saving in gas fuel, telephone, etc., changes, say..... 100 00

Making a total saving of..... \$2046 76
Which is more than Councilor McEwen and his friends could expect to do even if the bill proposed by them be carried, we should then have the Waterworks Act remain intact, a large amount of money saved to the city and officials generally, doing a fair amount of work for a fair amount of money.
