Interesting Talk At St. Paul's W.A.

Thursday afternoon Branch "A" of the Women's Auxiliary of St. Paul's church had a very special treat when Mr. Clyde White, representative of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, who is himself blind, addressed their meeting.

Mr. White spoke with feeling of those so afflicted but warned his listeners against giving too much sympathy but a kindly offered arm on the street or elsewhere would be much appreciated. The charter was granted March 1918, it was organized for the benefit of all blind Canadians regardless of race color, or creed.

Mr. White said, "Everyone should protect their eyes, and it is false economy to use ill fitting glasses." Although blind, Mr. White said he was quite happy and always enjoyed life.

The Blind Institute of the Maritimes has three home teachers, who are blind. They are fully trained in all handicrafts. They are available to any blind person who would desire training and they can be had free of charge.
