

### Study Survival Under A-Bombs

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—What can you do to survive a massive atomic attack?  
Would you be safer fleeing from densely populated areas, away from strategic targets; or would your best bet be to take your life on a scientifically-designed shelter system?  
Researchers at the naval radiological defence laboratory here have come up with a carefully-integrated survival system in which strong shelters play a vital part. They have studied the problem for years and say that theirs is the "only workable approach."  
They call it the "radiological recovery system."  
NO ALTERNATIVE  
"All of our study has left us no alternative but this," said Capt. Richard S. Mandelkorn, naval officer in charge of the laboratory. "And national planners seem to be coming around to our way of thinking."  
Since 1946, when the U.S. Navy established the laboratory to find out how to decontaminate ships used in the H-bomb test at Bikini, its staff of 300 scientists, aided by as many technicians, administrative and military personnel, has spent about \$5,000,000 a year studying the effects of nuclear devices. Much of the research is secret.  
It has grown to take in the whole problem of radiological defence and is the only laboratory in the U.S. attacking all aspects of the problem.  
NO POINT IN RUNNING  
"We know what must be done to meet successfully a mass atomic attack," Mandelkorn said. "The idea is to hide in the hills, away from the laboratory is concerned, evacuations are of little or no value because, in a mass attack, nobody can predict fallout-free locations in which to take refuge."  
At a cost of around \$3,000,000, spent over a period of four to five years, 100,000 persons could be assured of a good chance of survival.

### New Stratford Theatre Is Structurally Unique

The New Stratford Shakespearean Festival theatre, which opens July 1 and will be the scene of countless powerful stage dramas, is in its construction, something of a living drama in itself.  
This is indicated in a talk with Charles Hershfield, University of Toronto professor who was consulting structural engineer for the project.  
It was a drama which the playwrights, the engineers and builders had to write as they went along without being sure just how they would bring it to a final curtain.  
The engineering problems centered particularly around erection of the dome roof which—without supporting columns within the main theatre—comers the auditorium.

When all is finished, the roof—including its steel and timber decking and the inside ceiling—will constitute a "dead load" of 425 tons and will be capable of sustaining an additional 810-ton "live-load" of snow or other material which may be put or come upon it.

**Average Age Of Cabinet Ministers**  
OTTAWA (CP)—Average age of 17-member Progressive Conservative cabinet which took office Friday is 54 years. This compares with an average of 56.5 for the outgoing Liberal cabinet.  
However, the Liberal cabinet numbered 21 ministers. The average of the Conservative ministers likely will change when Prime Minister Diefenbaker completes his cabinet roster.  
Oldest member of the new government is minister without portfolio J. M. Macdonnell, 72. Next is Defence Minister Penikese, 69.  
Youngest Conservative minister is Postmaster-General Hamilton at 38. Solicitor-General Balcer is 39.

### CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.  
NORTH: ♠K64, ♥AKJ8, ♦KQ3, ♣A107  
WEST: ♠J102, ♥1072, ♦A1087, ♣942  
EAST: ♠9875, ♥Q9653, ♦853, ♣AK6  
SOUTH: ♠A93, ♥J96542, ♦KQ6  
The bidding: South West North East  
1 ♠ Pass 2 ♥ Pass  
3 ♦ Pass 4 NT Pass  
5 ♣ Pass 6 ♦ Pass  
Opening lead—jack of spades.  
One of the most remarkable hands on record is this gem which appears in *Reese on Play*. West's A-10-8-7 of diamonds over declarer's J-9-6-5 apparently constitute two impregnable trump tricks. Even when all four hands are studied the slam contract appears impossible to make.
