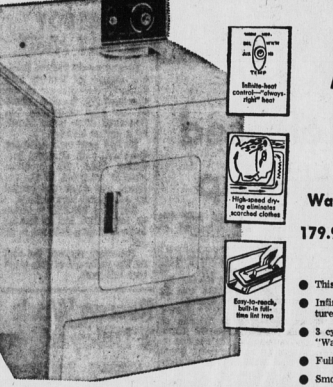

Att'y-General Is Silent

It was unknown yesterday if the Attorney-General's department asked the P.E.I. Temperance Commission to draw up a new set of regulations concerning the sale of liquor to private clubs. Attorney-General Albas Farmer had no comment.

Commission chairman Blake Wood has advised the clubs, by letter, that a new method of policing the clubs will soon be set up.

Mr. Farmer said "the commission has the power to do this sort of thing on its own." The letter to club operators said, in part, that the reason for the new regulations was a charges directed at the attorney-general's department insinuating that clubs are responsible for the overcrowding at Queens County Jail.

The new regulations are expected to deal with hours that clubs may sell liquor, use of profane language in clubs, the presence of intoxicated persons on club premises and entertainment. It is expected that a corps of inspectors will be appointed to enforce the new regulations.

Highway Deaths Near Record High

 With the reported death in Halifax of a young woman injured in a traffic accident here some weeks ago, the number of traffic fatalities in this province is fast approaching an all-time record. So far this year the number of deaths is believed to stand at 23, as against 30 in 1959 when the record high was established on Island highways.

The following year the number took a sharp drop, when 13 persons met with fatal highway accidents, then in 1961 it moved up to 18 and last year jumped to 24. At the same time, property damage as a result of highway accidents has already set a record in this year, with 1,049,000 in the first nine months of this year, when it amounted to \$458,601. This compares unfavorably with the previous record of 1961, when property damage totalled \$427,241 in a full year.

Last year set a record for the total number of accidents when 2,125 were reported. Of these, 211 were listed as fatal accidents involving 24 deaths. This year, Sept. 30, only three were 1,653 accidents reported, 18 of them fatal involving the killing of 23 people.

So far this year, in addition to the fatalities, there were 329 people injured on the highways in accidents. While this is a lower figure than for the previous four years, it covers only the first nine months of 1963.

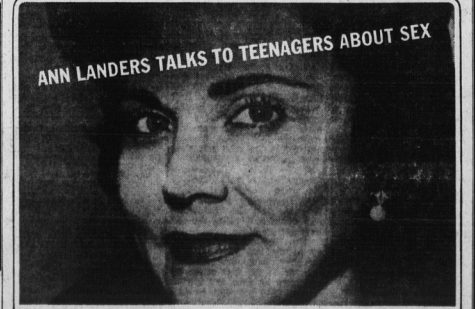
In those previous years, the totals were 309 for 1959, 385 for 1960, 386 for 1961, and 379 for 1962.

For those same years, the total number of accidents was 881; 901; 1,161; and 1,238. Property damage for these years was \$386,874; \$598,971; \$427,244; and \$398,503.
