Disclose Origin Of Empty Tomb

CARIO. (Reuters)—The empty tomb of Sakkara, opened last week, was built nearly 5,000 years ago for Sakhmet, one of the successors of Zoser, founder of the third dynasty of pharaohs, it was disclosed today.

His name was found stamped on four jar seals lying in underground compartments of the tomb, in an unfinished pyramid.

Zakariah Gonenim, the Egyptologist who discovered the step pyramid in 1881, had hoped to find the mummy of an ancient pharaoh when the tomb was opened this week.

This bitter anti-climax to two years of work at Sakkara, 18 miles from Cairo, was regarded here as the greatest archaeological disappointment of the century.

But the excavations yielded a large number of vases and vessels and animal remains and threw new light on the architecture of pyramids.

Officials have announced that the tomb will be closed at the end of June and work resumed at the end of the 1954 summer season.
