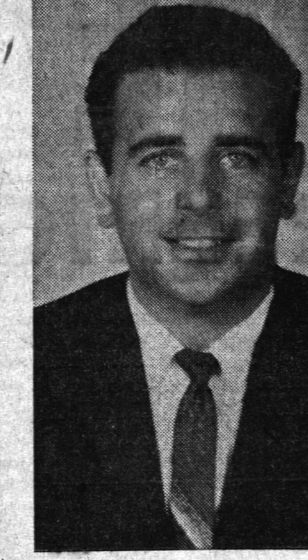

Crops Look Good, Farmers Told At O'Leary Field Day

O'LEARY — The Dominion Department of agriculture in cooperation with the Provincial Department held an Illustration Station Field Day yesterday at the farm of Robert Woodside and son in Knutsford near O'Leary.

Mr. W. M. Black, Agronomist, acted as chairman. Following a welcome by Mr. Woodside the first speaker was the Provincial Deputy Minister of Agriculture who expressed his pleasure in being back again in O'Leary and gave an interesting lecture on "Crop Production."

ENOUGH FEED

He stated that all crops look good this year and predicted plenty of feed for stock this winter.

Mr. R. C. Parent, superintendent of the Dominion Experimental Farm in Charlottetown spoke to the farmers on the topic "Agricultural Research." He emphasized the importance of having soil analyzed. Soils are 78 percent low in organic matter, 55 percent low in nitrogen, 46 percent low in phosphorus and 27 percent low in phosphorus and 42 percent was strongly acid.

Our soils respond quickly to treatment, he said, and displayed

speaker, dealt mainly with "Hog Quality". To start a young pig at 30 pounds and bring him to 200 would consume 585 pounds of feed, he said, and stressed the importance of getting hogs to market at this weight in order for them to Grade A 1.

"There is too much waste in

feeding overweight hogs," he maintained.
