Science Academy Honors D. J. Auld

Because of his "sustained and creditable contribution toward the advancement of science," Dr. John W. Auld, formerly of Covehead, P.E.I., has been invited to become a member of the New York Academy of Science.

The invitation is signed by E. Thomas Miner, executive director.
