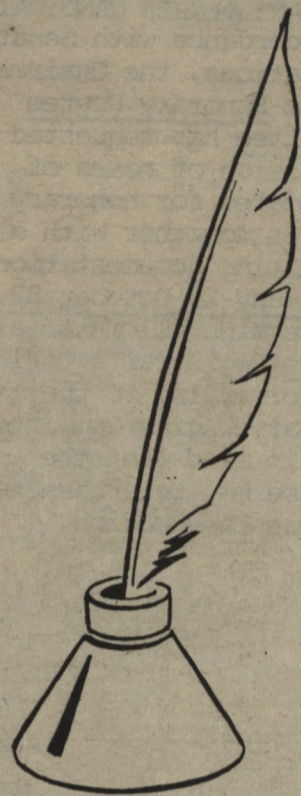


WRITING LAB

As newly appointed Provincial Coordinator for the Canadian Organization of Part-Time University Students (COPUS), I would suggest the time to ask ourselves that question is now.

Because most Mature and Part-Time students have families, and are not free to seek educational opportunities in other areas, they are totally dependent on UPEI. Therefore if post-secondary education is important to the students who lack mobility, now is the time to act in a responsible manner.

As members of this University community we as Mature and Part-Time students must be aware of what is happening. I urge everyone to obtain a copy of the President's Planning Advisory Groups Report (copies are on reserve in the library) and study it very carefully. As concerned students we not only need to be aware, we are obliged to become more involved.

The choice is ours, are we going to be apathetic or are we going to be dynamic? Let's begin becoming more informed by attending Mature and Part-Time University Students (MAPUS), Student Council and Senate meetings. Because education is important to us let's keep our university an institution of higher education, one that will be recognized by other under-graduate and post-graduate Universities.
