

# Declares Urgent Need For National Anthem, Flag

CHICOUTIMI, Que., (CP) — Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson said here that "all parts" of Canada must approve the "symbols of our sovereignty" — a national flag and a Canadian anthem.

He said that only cannot exist without a general acceptance of the symbols in all provinces.

The issue of the flag and the anthem—a major election point in the recent Quebec election—was raised at Roberval, Que., during the prime minister's day-long campaign tour of the Lake St. John area of northeastern Quebec.

# Soviet Civilian Airliners Easily Changed To Bombers

GENEVA (Reuters) — Britain's Joseph Godber told the Russian disarmament conference here that Russia has more than 100 civilian airliners which could easily be converted into nuclear bombers.

Godber, chief British delegate to the conference, said the Soviet TU-104 aircraft is a civilian version of the TU-16 bomber and the TU-114 airliner is a version of the TU-22 bomber.

Godber said: "Now I am not for a moment suggesting the Soviet Union intends to use its civil airliners for such a purpose. I readily admit that the United Kingdom could also modify its aircraft and so in all probability could the U.S. and Canada.

He said if Canada is to remain strong and united it needs a distinctive flag and a national anthem.

IS EMERGENCY  
"It is more than a need, it is a must. It is an emergency."

WOULD HAVE POTENTIAL  
Thus he said, if nuclear-delivery vehicles were scrapped in the first stage of general dis-

armament as the Soviet plan proposed, Russia "would enter stage two with an improved array of aircraft originally designed as bombers."

He also said that the end of the first stage would see stocks of nuclear warheads untouched. The conference must face up to the difficulty of verifying the abolition of nuclear weapons and would get nowhere by pretending the problem did not exist.

Godber repeated his statement of last month that a strategic nuclear warhead now can be contained in a cylinder 30 inches long and 2 1/2 inches in diameter.

Russia's Valerian Zorin attacked any idea that a United Nations peace force should be equipped with nuclear weapons.

He made several formal speeches in French, reading from a prepared text. He said Conservative policy meant economic development for Quebec — particularly for the pulp and paper industry, a major factor in the economic structure of this area.

# Boy Is Charged In Poisonings

LONDON (Reuters) — A 14-year-old schoolboy whose interest was chemistry administered dangerous poisons over a long period to his father, mother, sister and a school friend, a juvenile court was told here.

"I grew on me like a drug habit," he said in a statement to police.

The boy appeared on charges of administering a noxious thing to his sister, father and school friend.

The boy's mother died before he told the police about the poisonings, said prosecutor Philip Radcliffe.

"I do not make any suggestions about that, although he

says he had given her poison," Radcliffe told the court.

Radcliffe said the boy told police he poisoned his 25-year-old sister with Antimony Potassium Tartrate, which is also tried on his school friend several times.

He also put Belladonna in his sister's tea.

He bought two other drugs — Thallium and Digitalis but did not administer them to anyone, Radcliffe said.

The boy added in his statement to the police: "I realize how stupid I have been with the poison. I knew this all along but I could not stop."

# British Lords Hear Warning Against Birth Control Pills

LONDON (AP) — A warning against birth control pills was issued by the House of Lords as the lords debated against Asia's population increase.

"The marketing of birth control pills is a colossal margin of profit," said Baroness Edith Summerskill, a labor peer and a doctor.

"The sex instinct is universal," she said. "Control pills will not be limited to women suffering from a specific disease. All the powerful media of advertising and propaganda would be directed to the healthy, with the promise of enjoyment without fear of consequences."

Lady Summerskill spoke during a debate on Asia's population growth in which the government was asked to fund scientific research for a socially acceptable solution.

"There would be no shortage of customers for cheap oral contraceptives," said Lady Summerskill. "A woman's happiness depends primarily upon happy personal relations in the home."

"The fact that an oral contraceptive may have the most serious long-term ill-effects will not deter some women desperately anxious to establish their short-term personal happiness."

**Gov't Plans Access Road To NWT Mine**

OTTAWA (CP) — An all-weather road to the mineral deposits at Pine Point in the Northwest Territories will be built by the federal government, announced.

The new road, in cost \$5,000,000, will leave the Mackenzie Highway about seven miles north of Hay River and run 32 miles east to Pine Point.

Construction of a joint rail-highway bridge across the Hay River is to be started early this summer. The department said the bridge will be completed by next fall and that the road will reach Pine Point the following year.

The department said that when the CNR completes its rail link to Pine Point in 1963, it is expected the road will reach 2,000 persons will be established there.

A new railway is being built primarily to haul lead-zinc ore concentrates in the Consolidated Mining and Smelting refinery at Trail, B.C.
