

# Tyne Valley Delegation Will Ask For Road Paving Program

A decision to send a delegation to meet the Provincial Government to request for the immediate paving of a road connecting the Tyne Valley Health Centre with the pavement at Ellerslie village was taken at an emergency meeting of residents of the various school districts of the area Tuesday evening. The meeting was well attended by people from Tyne Valley, Elmsdale, Mount Pleasant and Northam, most of whom travelled by tractor or heavy trucks.

The meeting was called on short notice after Dr. G.E. Robinson had advised the monthly meeting of the Health Centre on Monday night that he would plan to leave the community in 1958 unless immediate steps were taken to provide better roads in the district, particularly permanent road connecting Tyne Valley with the Western Road.

At Tuesday night's meeting Mr. Donald MacLean was appointed chairman and he outlined the situation and said that promises of permanent roads had been given the district some years ago but these had not been carried out, chiefly because of dissonance among the people as to what route this road should take.

He said that it had been suggested that the road from Grand River through Tyne Valley connecting with the Western Road at Portage shall be paved. Others at the meeting suggested paving the Tyne Valley Station Road, the Northam Road and the so-called
