Funeral Of Late Gordon Rice To Be Held This Afternoon

The funeral of the late Gordon M. Rice, will be held this afternoon from Trinity Church, Charlottetown. Mr. Rice died suddenly from a heart attack in Summerside last Wednesday.

Widely known throughout the Island, he spent his lifetime in the teaching profession. During World War II he served with the Royal Canadian Air Force.

During his teaching career on the Island, Mr. Rice served at Darnley, Vernon River, and Spring Park, while School Unit No. 1 was in existence, he served as supervisor. He was also supervisor of public schools from 1946 until last year.

He became principal of Summerside elementary school at the beginning of the 1957 term and served in that capacity until his sudden death this week. He had been about his duties as usual on Wednesday. A person who apparently enjoyed good health, Mr. Rice's death comes as a distinct shock to his family and his many acquaintances throughout the Province.

Surviving are his wife, the former Hazel Parsons of Toronto and three children. His mother, two sisters and two brothers also survive.

The sisters are Izell, Mrs. Lester Cameron, City; Margaret, married in Ontario; Irvine in Central Ontario and Richard (Dick) who resides in Saint John.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p.m. at Trinity Church, Charlottetown. The Rev. W. G. Hogg, Minister, will officiate.

Wharf Extension Contract For Vernon River Awarded

OTTAWA—The Federal Department of Public Works has awarded a contract in the amount of \$16,977.50 to Edward MacCallum, Contractors, Brackley Beach, P.E.I., for construction of a wharf extension at Vernon River, P.E.I. December 1st, 1958 has been specified as completion date for the project.

The L-shaped extension will be composed of two arms, one measuring approximately 112' by 12' and the other 26' by 62'. The first section will begin at the south wall of the existing wharf and extend south to where the second section will stand. This portion will curve slightly and continue northward to the steel pile wall of the Trans-Canada Highway culvert.

Integration Of Immigrants To Be Studied By United Ch.

A national commission to study the integration of immigrants into Canadian life was recommended today at the annual meeting of the United Church's Board of Home Missions. The Board met in Toronto. Rev. Dr. Jack Leng reported on the immigration work of the United Church.

The Board approved the appointment of 265 student missionaries who will go out into rural and frontier areas this summer. Salaries of married ordained ministers have been increased to \$3,200 a year with free furnished manse, the Board was told.

Travel allowances for ministers serving big areas have also been increased. Highlight of today's meeting of the Board were the reports of mission superintendents:

Rev. H. M. Dawe, of Newfoundland. Dr. Gordon W. Porter, of Ot-

land, reported on shifts of population, business recession, increase in Christian education centres.

Dr. W. S. Godfrey, Sackville, N. B., deplored the fact that there are 59 vacant charges in his area.

Dr. J. A. Lyttle, of North Bay, said that in some Northern Ontario areas mines had been shut down, leaving a ghost town. Opening of new towns in the uranium area had challenged the church to open new ministries, he said.

Other mission superintendents told of work among new Canadians, Indians, frontier areas in western Canada, and coastal in-

"Hedgelee Jester Eileen", a six-year-old in 305 days produced 8,604 lbs. of milk, containing 552 lbs. fat testing 6.42 per cent. "Magic Wendy M. G." in a 305-day period produced 8,357 lbs. milk, 473 lbs. fat testing 5.66. Wendy is also a six-year-old.

A three-year-old, "Hedgelee Jester Heather" in 305 days produced 8,327 lbs. milk, 497 lbs. fat with a test of 5.97. She ranked 12th in her class for all Canada. Another three-year-old owned by the Clark farm,

Mount Allison Chaplain To Address Men's Rally Here

Rev. Donald I. MacIntosh, chaplain at Mount Allison University will be the theme speaker at a zone rally for men of the United Church comprising Queens and Kings Counties to be held at Trinity Church on Sunday, May 4.

Rev. Mr. MacIntosh who assumed the post of chaplain at Mount A. last autumn is rated as one of the most forceful speakers in the Maritime conference of the United Church. His messages have a particular appeal to the men of the Church.

During Sunday afternoon, he will speak on the subject, "Fulfill your Ministry". An interesting program of discussion has been arranged following Mr. MacIntosh's remarks.

In the evening Rev. Mr. MacIntosh will be the speaker at the regular service of worship at Trinity. The men attending the rally will be present in a body. Two lay-men will assist the Minister in the service.

The rally is being held under the sponsorship of the Prince Edward Island Presbytery Men's Council. Mr. Keith Lapp of Summerside is President.

It is expected that the rally will draw upwards of 300 men. Recently a similar rally was held at Summerside for Prince County. Over 100 men attended on that occasion.

Final Year Cost Graduate \$1,620

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's university graduate students last year spent an average \$1,620 during the college year, the bureau of statistics said Thursday.

The statistics were drawn from a sample survey of 636 students — representing about one-fifth of all Canada's full-time students.

Of the total, 32 per cent paid the year's expenses by grants-in-aid, summer work savings and part-time work during the term. The sample included 394 single students, who came from homes where the parents' average income was \$4,909 and where parents' contributions ranged from less than \$2,000 to \$10,000. Single students reported their total income was more than their expenditures.

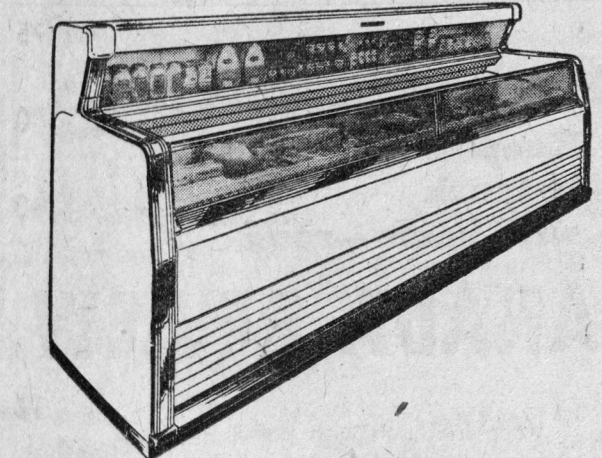
