### PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

The Yukon Deal Bill.

Opposition Offer an Amendment.

OTTAWA, March 5.—The Yukon discussion was continued, yesterday, in the House of Commons, by Mr. Bell, of Pictou, Mr. Marcot, Sir Louis Davies and others. At eleven o'clock last night, Mr. Borden (Halifax) proposed to adjourn the debate. But the Premier refused.

Sir Wilfrid said that the measure was urgent, and that too much time had been lost already.

Sir Charles Tupper and Mr. Borden pointed out that the Premier was not so impressed with the urgency of the bill when the House adjourned for one week to allow Ministers and their supporters to go to the help of the Hardy Government in the Ontario elections.

Sir Charles Tupper undertook that, if the Government would permit an adjournment, he would do what he could to expedite the discussion.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier wanted the Opposition leader to agree that the debate should end next Tuesday; but the Opposition leader could not promise that. Consequently, Mr. Borden proceeded, after Sir Charles had informed the Premier that he would no longer consider himself under obligation to do anything towards hastening the debate to a conclusion.

Mr. Borden closed an able argument which, in spite of the late hour, was heard with marked attention, by moving that the bill be not read a second time, but that it be

"Resolved, That this House, while recognizing the necessity for providing adequate facilities for transportation into the Canadian Yukon gold fields, regards as indefensible the terms and conditions of the proposed contract, but will cordially support a grant of substantial assistance in aid of the immediate construction of a railway the best available route, under such conditions and safeguards as will prevent the creation of any railway or mining monopoly."

Mr. Morrison, of British Columbia, moved the adjournment of the debate, and the House rose at an early hour this morning.

### AN ALASKAN RAILWAY

Conditions Imposed Upon Canada

TO OBTAIN A RIGHT OF WAY.

WASHINGTON, March 5.—After a warm debate, the Senate has adopted a bill for railway extension in Alaska as proposed. An amendment to strike out the fisheries section of the bill was defeated, and the bill as it stands makes it incumbent upon Canada, in order to secure bonding privileges and other rights of transshipment at Fort Wrangel, to make several concessions to the United States, among them being the right of Atlantic fishermen to enter Canadian ports for the purchase of bait and supplies.

### JAPAN TAKES A HAND.

Wants to Know How Long

Russia Intends to Occupy Port Arthur.

LONDON, March 5.—A despatch to the Daily Mail from Sien Tien, China, says that Japan has addressed a Note to Russia demanding an immediate and explicit statement on the question of the continued occupation of Port Arthur.

Mr. Powell's majority is, however, reduced to two.

NEWS NOTES.

King George of Greece now finds his throne safe. Some fool tried to assassinate him and thus restored his popularity.

The influence of the Klondike outfitting on local trade is shown by the custom house statistics. The total outputs at Victoria for February were valued at \$376,052, against \$222,866 for the same month of the last year, and the duty collected was \$73,584, against \$51,096. The free imports for February came to \$115,839.

The passing of the battleship *Victorious* through the Suez canal is said to have created a great sensation in Europe. It has been thought that no ship larger than the *Barfleur* could pass through this canal and that therefore Great Britain's power to reinforce her fleets in the sea was limited; but the *Victorious* is one of the nine great British Ironclads of the Majestic class—the largest afloat, so that at any time it will be possible for Great Britain to send a fleet into Chinese waters as powerful as that she has in the Mediterranean.
