ANSWER: Your household apparently is entirely bossed by your father, who has more than a wee touch of tyranny in his make-up. Any fair-minded parent, no matter how strict a disciplinarian, would concede the right of a sixteen-year-old girl to participate in school activities, at least on week-ends. Parental authority, as demonstrated at the first opportunity, it's responsible for many too-young and too-hasty marriages and divorces, for many tragic teen-age romances. Girls who are too severely restricted at home are inclined to make the first dash for freedom, to accept the first love offered, without stopping to discriminate.

A parent's responsibility in rearing a child involves considerably more than clothing, feeding, and housing his young. His chief job is to rear a child to a sense of responsibility that will enable the youngster to tackle the problems of maturity as they come along. Naturally, if a young girl is not permitted to mingle with her contemporaries, or to engage in their available activities, she'll never learn to cope with people or problems. Over-protecting a child, whether for reasons of loving solicitude, or an ornery desire to deprive her of fun, is harmful. Teen-agers have a natural tendency to strain at disciplinary measures—the desire for larger fields to conquer is part of their development—and when this desire is aggravated by an unreasonable restraint, it is bound to lead to trouble.

Admittedly, it is a most difficult thing for parents to decide between over-laxity and over-repression. It is just one of the problems confronting parents, especially those with teen-age children. A happy solution may mean the difference between a maladjusted and a well-balanced individual. Association of boys and girls is a teenage need, which a wise parent will direct, rather than quell.

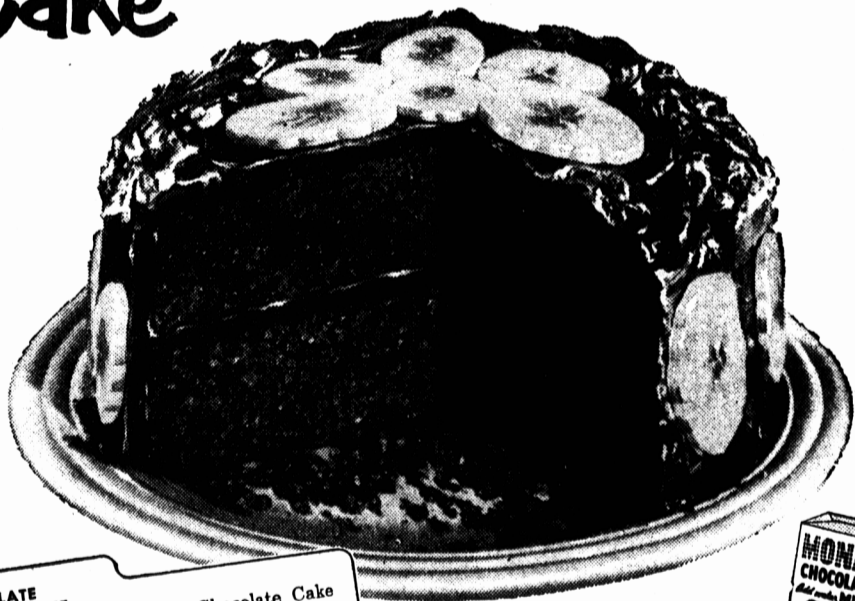

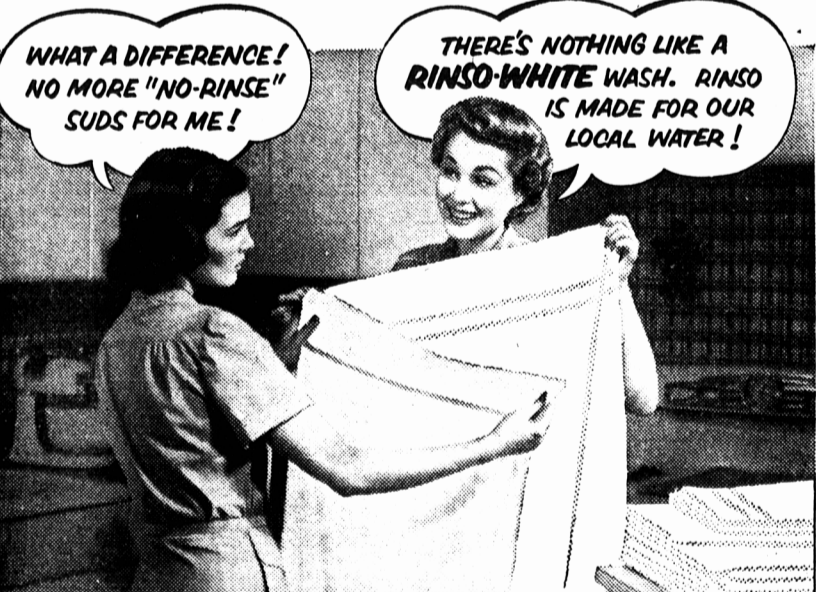
**CHOCOLATE BANANA CAKE**

## Betwixt Two Elizabeths

### The CIVIL WAR

1642-1649 IN 1642, THE STRUGGLE BETWEEN THE ROYALISTS AND ROUNDHEADS BEGAN. THERE WERE FEW IN ENGLAND TRAINED IN THE ARTS OF WAR AND CITIZENS WERE HASTILY DRILLED INTO SHAPE. AFTER INITIAL FAILURES, VICTORIES, NOTABLY AT MARSTON MOOR IN 1644 AND AT NAZEBY IN 1645, (WHERE THE NEW MODEL ARMY, OF WHICH OLIVER CROMWELL WAS LIEUTENANT-GENERAL, ROUTED THE ROYALISTS), LED TO THE ENDING OF HOSTILITIES.



WAR AGAIN BROKE OUT IN 1648, BUT THE ROYALISTS WERE CRUSHED AT PRESTON. IN 1649, A HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE WAS SET UP AND CHARLES I BROUGHT UP FOR TRIAL. HE WAS CONDEMNED TO DEATH, AND HIS EXECUTION SHOCKED THE CIVILISED WORLD.
