MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar Monday closed at a discount of 2 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1/2. It took 97 1/2 cents Canadian to buy \$1 American. Pound Sterling \$2.75, down 3/4.

WINNIPEG (CP) — Increased selling by international interests sent wheat prices down Monday on the Winnipeg grain exchange but other prices moved in a narrow range.
Lakehead prices of Class Two, IWA and domestic wheat were down 1/2 cent except Class Two Durums which were unchanged.

Montreal Stocks
Montreal, (CP) — A mixed tone ruled the stock market at the close Monday after stronger tendencies had prevailed throughout most of the session. Volume was moderate.
Noranda chalked up a 3 1/2-point gain at 73 1/2 and Canada Cement at 108 was up two points. Canadian Industries and Price Brothers were 1/2 better at 5 1/4 and 38 1/2, respectively. Half-point gains were scored by Hudson Bay Mining at 46 1/2 and Atlas Steel at 12 1/2. Industrial Acceptance, Consolidated Paper, Shawinigan, Brazilian Traction and Steico increased minor fractions.

Toronto Stocks
TORONTO, (CP) — Junior Golds and base metals forged ahead to lead the market upward at the close Monday.
Favorable drill reports from the Beaver Lodge area of Saskatchewan went sent some uranium issues to new yearly highs. Included Algom Uranium, and Macdonald-Cockshutt. Golds that hit 1954 highs were Sullivan, Hagasa and Elder. In uraniums Chimo and Nesbit Labine were well up along with Campbell Red Lake, East Malartic and Preston East Dome in golds. Noranda posted \$74 at the close for a new 1954 high.
Western oils were weak. But strong gains were made by Canoro Oil, Canoro Natural Gas, Canadian Southern Petroleum, Pacific Petroleum and Peace River Gas.

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market climbed to a new high since Oct. 22, 1929, Monday, largely because of a 1 1/2-point advance by Du Pont, one of the prime market leaders.
The rise in Du Pont, which gained momentum as the session progressed, sent the price to 143 1/2. There were unconfirmed rumors that the stock would be split and that the company planned to distribute among its stockholders its big holding of General Motors shares.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks climbed 90 cents to \$128.20.
