Capable Trio Named To Select 'Islander'

Mrs. Douglas MacGowan, Montague, Charles Linkletter, Summerside, and Gordon Bennett, Charlottetown, have been named by The Evening Patriot as judges who have agreed to select the 1964 "Islander of the Year". Mrs. MacGowan, an outstanding figure in the entertainment field, has taken a prominent part in both the P.E.I. Music Festival and the Provincial Drama Festival. She was appointed governor of the Dominion Drama Festival in 1955, and last year took an active part when the 1964 finals were staged here. A performer on stage and radio as a child, she has studied ballet, music and drama and twice toured Canada as a professional entertainer. She also toured Canada Army posts in Europe as a member of a Canadian civilian concert party. She has directed four regional drama festival entries and has won awards for best director and best actress. Charles Linkletter, one of the top men in the motel field in the province, operates the Linkletter Motel in Summerside. TOURIST PROMOTION Mr. Linkletter takes a keen interest in tourist promotion for the Island. He has served two terms as president of the P.E.I. Tourist Association and has represented that group at various meetings across Canada. The third member of the panel, Gordon Bennett, is probably one of the best known educators in Prince Edward Island as hundreds of students at Prince of Wales College have passed through his classrooms and office over the years. This has given Mr. Bennett opportunity to personally know them and their problems and many have taken advantage of it by turning to him for advice when needed. He has been director of studies and registrar as well as being in charge of admissions and has long been known for his ability as professor of chemistry. Just last year during Centennial celebrations Mr. Bennett, in an entirely different field, was responsible to a great extent for the tremendous success

Abolition Of White Ensign Called Blow To Navy Morale

WINNIPEG (CP) — Abolition of the White Ensign and replacement by the new Canadian flag is a blow to the morale of the navy, the national president of the Naval Officers' Associations of Canada said here. L. B. McIlhagga, a retired navy captain, said in a statement the step is "totally unnecessary in view of some of the alternatives open to the government."

National defence headquarters last week ordered the navy to remove the White Ensign when the new maple leaf is proclaimed shortly. The White Ensign is a red cross on a white field with the Union Jack in the upper left corner next to the mast.

Mr. McIlhagga said the NOAC two years ago suggested the White Ensign, as flown on Canadian ships, should have the Canadian coat of arms on the fly but the suggestion was not approved.

When the national flag debate began last year, the associations proposed retaining the White Ensign but substituting the new Canadian flag for the Union Jack in the upper corner. If this has been adopted he said the Canadian navy would have maintained, "at least in broad outline, a distinctive flag reminiscent of that which it has used ever since its inception in 1910; and it would have followed the example of the newer Commonwealth countries, most of which, even though republics, have maintained the basic design of the ensign, substituting their own national flag in the upper canton."

Architect, Island Native Dies In Calif.

Robert Hall Orr, 91, a noted architect and former Islander, died recently in Los Angeles, Calif., after a long illness. Word of Mr. Orr's death was received by Jeannette Orr of Kensington. Other relatives live in Charlottetown, Bay View and Cavendish.

Mr. Orr moved to California in 1922 with his parents. Following graduation from the University of Illinois and admission to the American Institute of Architects, he played a part in the design of many important buildings in the Los Angeles area. He is survived by a daughter, Tanya Givens; a brother, James, and three sisters, Mrs. Virena Pendergast, Mrs. Angie Wellman and Mrs. Ida Brooks.
