The Experts Say

This is National Salad Week—seven days set aside to point up the value of crisp, colorful uncooked dishes.

Sponsored by the Canadian Horticultural Council, Salad Week was founded to promote the use of farm and garden products.

The Federal Department says there are three types of persons—those who eat salads because they like them; those who eat salads to be healthy; those who won't eat salads at all.

For a wife faced with a non-salad-eating husband, the Department suggests a subtle approach.

Does he like cheese? Then try a salad in which cheese is the dominant ingredient. Is salmon a favorite? Stress salmon.

"Many a man... has been weaned away from less nutritious food to a liking for salads by such wiles," advises the Department. "But don't expect him to ever admit it."

Home economists of the Department's consumer section have a few tips on dressing which may prove valuable to the salad-conscious housewife.

Here is their recipe for a French dressing.

Ingredients: One-quarter cup cider vinegar; three-quarters cup salad oil; one teaspoon sugar; dash of pepper; one-half teaspoon salt; one-half teaspoon dry mustard.

Place all ingredients in a jar with a tight-fitting lid. Shake until thick and creamy looking. Store in a cold place. Shake well before using.

For variety—Add two tablespoons chopped parsley, one chopped hard-cooked egg and one-quarter cup chopped cooked beets. Use this dressing with a plain lettuce salad.

Add one-quarter cup tomato catsup and serve on meat salad.

Add one teaspoon of meat sauce and serve with vegetable and egg salads.

Add three tablespoons of peanut butter and use on cabbage or carrot salads.

Add three tablespoons of grated cheese and serve with vegetable salads.

Another recipe:—Carrot salad is a favorite with those who like bright dishes. Ingredients: One bunch of carrots cooked and diced; one can peas, drained; one teaspoon chopped onion, celery diced in small pieces; dash of lemon juice; salt and pepper to taste; two hard-boiled eggs; salad dressing.

Line a salad bowl with lettuce. Fill in centre with salad. Slice eggs and put on top.

Recent tests have proved that most persons like frozen peas with sugar. At the California Foods Research Institute, 190 women each were given two paper cups of peas. Of this figure, 165 preferred those to which three per cent sugar (by weight) had been added. Thirty-one preferred peas packed in their natural state, without sugar. Four expressed no preference.

Sydney Man Is Appointed

OTTAWA, July 26—(CP)—Charles Gavsie, a 44-year-old lawyer who calms Sydney, N. S., as his home-town Tuesday was appointed Deputy Minister of National Revenue for Taxation.

He moves up from the post of Assistant Deputy Minister to replace W. V. Scully, who is leaving the department to accept a post with the Steel Company of Canada in Hamilton.

The promotion of Mr. Gavsie was announced by acting Prime Minister Howe, who was instrumental in bringing the former Maritimer to Ottawa during the Second World War.

War. The promotion dates from Aug. 1. Mr. Gavsie was born in New York, but he calms that was an "accident." His family had lived in Sydney but moved temporarily to New York and he was born during the stay. The family moved back to Sydney when he was two years old.

Like Mr. Howe, Mr. Gavsie is a graduate of Dalhousie University in Halifax. In 1930, he obtained his Master of Laws degree at Harvard University and a year later began an active practice in Montreal.

He gave up his private practice in 1941 to join the legal branch of the Wartime Department of Munitions and Supply, headed by Mr. Howe. He was appointed Assistant General Counsel of the Department in 1946 and General Counsel in 1948.

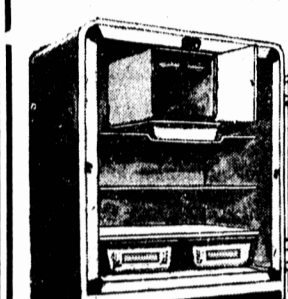

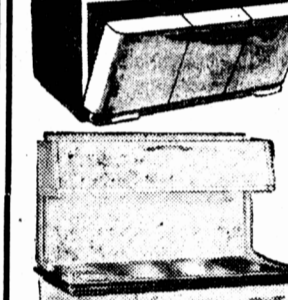

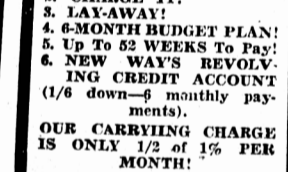
