Evidence Taken in Mitchell Inquest
 The verdict that Eugene Mitchell came to his death in a cell at the Police Station about 3.30 a.m. Sunday morning from alcoholic poisoning was returned last night by a coroner's jury empanelled to inquire into circumstances surrounding the death of the deceased.
 Coroner of the inquest held in the Court Room at City Hall was Dr. J. D. MacGulgan. Mr. J. P. Nicholson represented the Crown. Members of the jury were Messrs. George MacLeod, foreman, George Berrigan, Russell Abbott, William Hughes, Merritt Forsythe, George Sutherland and Harry Hardy.
 Five witnesses gave evidence and the report of Dr. Harold Shaw, Provincial pathologist was read. This report stated that all blood vessels in the brain were engorged and a high state of intoxication was indicated.
 Dr. R. G. Lea, Charlottetown physician, testified that the deceased was dead when he first saw him about three o'clock Sunday morning in the cell.
 Cst. Wakelin, police officer, stated that he and Cst. Howatt picked up deceased who was lying on the ground on the south side of the sidewalk in front of Herb Campbell's on Grafton Street about 11.15. He walked to the patrol he and the two officers and talked with the deceased who stated he had no evidence to supplement that given by Cst. Wakelin.
 Sgt. Sterns Webster testified that he saw deceased sleeping on bunk in cell at 12.30 Sunday morning. Around three o'clock he noticed that the man had fallen to the floor and on bending down to pick him up found out he was dead.
 Russell MacDonald last saw deceased in Herb Campbell's about 10.50 Saturday night. Deceased ordered three bottles of spruce beer, one for himself and two for friends. He drank about three quarters of a glass of beer and fell to the floor. Was taken outside and patrol took him.
 Harry Redmond testified that he was well acquainted with the deceased and had seen him about one o'clock Saturday afternoon. He (deceased) was perfectly sober at that time and he had been seen in a sober condition at 8.30 that night. He heard deceased was subject to heart attacks.
 William Douglas Smith, Charlottetown, was talking to deceased, who was sober, for a few minutes at the corner of Kent and Prince Streets between eight and nine-thirty Saturday night. Testified that deceased had boarded at Central Hotel of which (Smith's) mother is landlady. Deceased was sober when eating his supper between five and six o'clock Saturday evening.

Describes Old Age Pensions Systems in U. S.
 OTTAWA, May 2—(CP)—Dr. George Davidson, Deputy Minister of Welfare, said today that many Canadians now receiving old-age pensions would not qualify for pensions in the United States.
 Testifying before the parliamentary committee on old-age security, Dr. Davidson said the United States residence and citizenship provisions in old-age pension legislation were no more generous than those in the Canadian legislation.
 In fact, he said, some United States regulations were less generous.
 He outlined for the committee the two pension systems in effect in United States and listed some of the amounts paid by various states. They ranged from a low of \$18 a month to a high of about \$80 a month. The payments start at 65 years. Canada's top pension amounts to about \$50 a month and is payable to needy persons 70 years and over.
 Dr. Davidson said the United States has an old age assistance program under which pensions are paid to the needy. The country also has a compulsory contributory old age and survivors insurance scheme. Pensions paid under the insurance plan average about \$28 a month for a single person while those paid under the means test program amount to about \$44 a month.
 The insurance plan was started in 1934 in the hope that eventually the means test assistance program could be abolished. But after 16 years of operations, the number of those receiving assistance was
