PLANT LINE.—Importers will kindly take notice that the last sailing for this season, of the S. S. Halifax from Boston for this port, will be on 26th Nov. and will please instruct their houses shipping freight by that steamship, to have it in time for the sailing from Boston on above date. Shippers will also take notice that the last sailing of S. S. Halifax from this port will be on 29th November.

A VALUABLE PROPERTY.—A mining expert, representing a large Boston concern, who has been examining the copper mines in Pictou Co., owned by Truro parties, was in town on Saturday last. This expert says the property is the best he has seen in Nova Scotia, and considers it very valuable, and has reported the same to his Boston Command.—Truro News.

COMING THIS WAY.—For the month of October the number of emigrants from British ports for Canada were: English, 1,063; Irish, 73; Scotch, 66; foreign, 912. During the ten months of the year the numbers were: English, 12,237; Irish, 745; Scotch, 1,596; and foreign, 2,896. The number of emigrants to Canada triples that of similar bookings for Australia during the year, and exceeds the Cape Colony total by 3,842.

BENZINE EXPLOSION.—Thos. Morris, a young lad of Guelph, Ont., was working near a can of benzine, when it exploded and set fire to his clothing. He rushed into the open air, a mass of flames. Frank Cole, a Great North Western Tel. Co's. lineman, who was passing at the time threw his coat around the burning boy, and succeeded in smothering the flames. Morris was severely burned around the body and legs, but will probably recover.

TIN PLATE INDUSTRY.—According to a Chase financial news bureau, the consolidation of the tin plate industry of the United States is now practically assured. The promoters say the \$50,000,000 of capital stock has already been oversubscribed. More than \$60,000,000 was underwritten in this city and applications from Chicago and vicinity received since announced to half a million. The organizers have figures showing that the output of the tin industry this year is 8,000,000 boxes and a low estimate places the product of next year at about 9,000,000.

MYSTERIOUS EXPLOSION.—A mysterious explosion occurred in the store of Charles Bragg, Truro, on Tuesday night. Two pounds of powder on the shelf in a teapot went off like a gun from some unknown cause. The front windows were demolished, dishes broken, goods injured, a lamp in the office upset and started a fire. Miss Laura Bragg was waiting on customers near where the explosion occurred and was seriously burned, and it is thought will lose her sight entirely. The fire was extinguished with a loss of probably \$300. The lamps had been lighted at five, but there was no flame in the shop afterward till the explosion.

RAILWAY TRAVEL.—An English authority says that within three years a man will be able to travel by rail straight through from cities on the continent to Port Arthur; in five years from the Cape to Alexandria, and there will be yet a third great line from Constantinople via Palestine, Persia India and Burma to Hong Kong. Further, he says: "The importance of these three great lines of communication cannot be sufficiently dwelt upon; it can certainly not be exaggerated. With the Siberian railway we have nothing to do now; with regard to the other two this is to be noted—to h of them meet in Palestine. Palestine is the great centre, the meeting of the roads. Whoever holds Palestine commands the great lines of communication, not only by land, but also by sea."

NOVA SCOTIA FISHERIES.

Said to be the Worst for Many Years past.

The Nova Scotia shore fisheries are by long odds the worst in years. This is true alike on the western and eastern coast, except in parts of Cape Breton. Notwithstanding this the receipts just now at the port of Halifax are fair, but this is considered due to all the available fish being hurried into market. The close of the season next month will show a decided shortage. Cod are bringing a dollar per quintal more than a year ago. Hard selected shore cod ex vessel are worth \$3.75 per quintal. Though the herring fishery, both in fat and poor, is a failure, there not being half an average, prices are about the same this year as last \$3 to \$3.25. The bank catch, it is estimated, will be 13,000 quintals less than last season.

The Puerto Rico fish market has been very good recently. Messrs Zwicker & Co., of Lunenburg, are said to have done better in fish shipments since the war began than for the past seven years, but it is not thought probable that the high prices will continue. In the British Islands prices are low compared with the cost of fish at Halifax.

The Magdalen Island mackerel catch is the best for two years, but in Nova Scotia very little has been done.
