

Beetles Noted Among Young Potato Plants

During the past week potato beetles and Colorado potato beetles have been seen on young potato plants, reports the Science Service Laboratory weekly bulletin. The flea beetles puncture small holes in the leaves and the adult potato beetles are laying eggs which will develop into the red larvae or "grubs" later in the season. If a DDT spray or dust is applied now it will kill these adult insects and reduce the populations throughout the summer. With the small plants only one nozzle per row is necessary. Reports have come in that maggots are attacking the potato sets in some areas. These are seed rot maggots and sometimes cause damage to the sets during cool backward weather. If the plants are above ground and have a good root system there is not much danger of these maggots destroying the crop, the Bulletin advises. If the maggots destroy the sets before they come up, it may be necessary to replant.

Street Graveling Work Discussed At Council Meeting

Considerable discussion regarding the quality of the gravel used in city street work featured a special meeting of the City Council held this week. As a result of the discussion a resolution moved by Councillor Elmer MacDonald and seconded by Mr. P. R. MacDonnac that street work be suspended until tenders for gravel could be called for was introduced. It was defeated on the deciding vote of Mayor J. D. Stewart. Councillor MacDonald criticized particularly the work being done on Union Street and said the trucks delivering the gravel were arriving on the job with half loads. He also expressed the belief that the gravel was not up to standard because of the amount of sand and clay it contained. He believed that instead of being 60 percent gravel and 40 percent binder the proportions were reversed. He questioned City Engineer H. A. Messervy on the matter and Mr. Messervy gave his opinion that the gravel used was the best obtainable on the Island. Councillor F. J. Storey, chairman of the Street Committee, proposed the resolution on the grounds that since the Council had already approved the work to be done it should be proceeded with. He said that the condition of Union Street was normal in view of the fact that graveling was being done and a heavy rain storm had just occurred. He agreed that perhaps the gravel was not as good as that which can be obtained from a pit in New Brunswick, but did state that the latter would cost twice as much. In any event, he said, the gravel used was up to specifications. A second resolution moved by Councillor MacDonald and seconded by Councillor Storey that a contract be awarded to M. F. Schurman Company for construction of city sidewalks at a price of 47 1/2 cents per foot was passed without dissent.
