We would like to remind students that the health plan for Canadians does NOT cover doctors' fees nor ward rate hospital costs. It is illegal in Canada for a private insurance company to sell insurance to a Canadian that will cover the cost of ward rate hospital care or medical or surgical fees which are billed for services performed in Canada for Canadians. Such insurance would, of course, be an unnecessary duplication in an area now assumed by a governmental agency. If you have any such costs, the Student Union Office will be pleased to advise you of the pro-

cedure to be followed. For those students who have received pay from the Student Union during 1980, we may advise that T4's have been completed and are being passed out. Any

questions concerning these may be made at the Business Office of the Student Union where they will be answered with courteous and consideration up to 31 January. After this, the forms will

be forwarded to the Income Tax Office. After 1 February anyone having any queries will be given an unsympathetic and rude reception. Up to 31 January, we'll look like this 😊, thereafter ☹️. Take warning please.

Weedless Wednesday

(IIS)-- Health and social minister Jim Lee, has declared departmental support for national non-smoking week, Jan, 18-24 including "Weedless Wednesday" on January 21.

Educational efforts by The P.E.I. Council on smoking and health will be aimed at 12 and 13 year old girls and boys in grades 6 and 7.

Mr. Lee noted that although adult smoking has decreased somewhat over the past 10 years, the percentage of teenage boys smoking remains about the same and the number of teenage girls smoking is actually increasing. "As potential parents and

examples for our future generation, it is important that we reach these

teenagers before the smoking habit is established," he said.
